## Statement of Evidence:

MINNESOTA DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES, BUREAU OF ENGINEERING.

Meander Corner #15, Section 26/35, Township 141 North, Range 27 West.

The original corner was established and monumented with a wood post by the General Land Office in 1874. Ties were taken to two B.T.'s, a 5" birch and a 5" poplar.

On October 4, 1977, the DNR Bureau of Engineering surveyors contacted the Cass County Recorder's and Surveyor's Offices; the U.S. Forest Service in Cass Lake; and private surveyors, Bill Okerman, Bemidji, and Walter Curo, Hackensack.

The U.S.F.S. had done some research on this corner in 1968. They had found some CCC notes indicating that there was a scribed stake, 20" tall, inplace, and in fair condition. The stake was said to be between the lake and a large rock and tied into 2 aspens to southeast.

Searched area of the corner and found a 3/4" I.P. about 18' from the lakeshore and 43' north of the remains of an old east-west fence. Fence is just a few feet into woods on north edge of what appears to be a garden. Followed fence to east for about 300'. Could find no evidence of fence from there to east. Appears fence may have been built to protect a garden spot. Found many rocks along lake bank. One at lake end of fence is especially large. Area to southeast of large rock is garden. Talked to Mr. Vern Vineski, owner of land to north. He bought his land in 1957 and hired Harold Curo to survey his south line. Curo had spent some time on the survey, but never came back and finished it. Vineski was of the opinion that Curo had set the 3/4" I.P. as a temporary point and never had determined the true corner. Mr. Vineski has assumed the fence to be his approximate boundary.

Talked to property owners to the south, but they could not provide any further information.

Assumed the corner to be lost. Reestablished it at a proportionate distance and on line between northeast and northwest section corners.
