

Statement of Evidence:

- 1918 U.S. General Land Office dependent resurvey established this corner and an iron pipe with a marked brass cap was set to mark the corner. The following bearing trees were marked: 7" J. Pine N 59 E 206 links and 7" Spruce N 31 W 330 links. Notes show corner in open marsh.
- 1970 USFS technician L. Witthoeft visited corner area. He did not find the monument but found the J. Pine bearing tree.
- 1980 USFS technician W. Olson found the marked GLO brass cap monument in good condition in the marsh up 10". A short steel fence post was placed along side the monument to aid in the stability. Steel sign posts were set approximately 4 feet west and south of the monument. The GLO J. Pine bearing tree was found alive at the record bearing and distance. Three new bearing trees were marked and are shown on this certificate.
- 1981 County Surveyor's Records in the Recorder's Office were checked and no resurvey information was found on this corner.
- 1981 On Dec. 22, I visited the corner and found items as per the 1980 USFS report. The J. Pine had partially over grown blaze with the scribing visible. I did not search for the Spruce BT. I accepted the found monument as marking the same position as when originally set in 1918.
