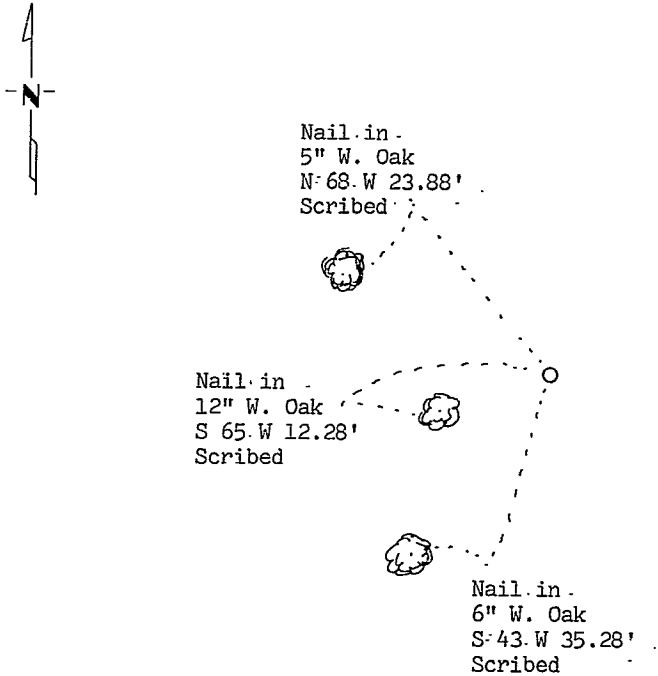

Statement of Evidence:

- 1918 U.S. General Land Office dependent resurvey established this corner and an iron pipe with a marked brass cap was set to mark the corner. The following bearing trees were marked: 10" Tamarac S 72-15 E 75 links and 10" N. Pine N 3-15 W 96 links.
- 1980 USFS technician W. Olson found the marked GLO brass cap monument in place in good condition. No evidence was found of the 1918 bearing trees. Three new bearing trees were marked. A steel sign post was set 4' west of the corner.
- 1981 County Surveyor's Records in the Recorder's Office were checked and no resurvey information was found on this corner.
- 1982 On Jan. 29, visited the corner and found items as per the 1980 USFS report. Snow depth prevented a detailed search for evidence of the 1918 bearing trees.
- 1982 On April 21, USFS technician C. Krause revisited the corner area and found the following evidence of the 1918 bearing trees: At N 3-15 W 63.4' found pine stump and log laying on the ground and at S 72-15 E 49.5' found burned tamarac stump. The iron pipe is badly rusted and was found in 6" of water at the base of a slope.

Accepted the found monument as marking the same position as set in 1918.
