- U.S. General Land Office survey set wood post for this corner and marked the following bearing trees: 8" Poplar N 32 E 40 links and 16" N. Pine S 18 W 70 links.
- County Surveyor's Record Book B pages 323 to 327 show survey by John Curo. Curo states that he found both bearing trees plainly marked, but that they do not agree with the original notes. He sets a new wood post after which the original bearing trees are: 16" W. Pine N 18 W 70 links (46.2') and 8" Poplar S 32 E 44.9'.
- After traversing in Section 34, I computed the corner location based on Curo!s 1907 survey. Found a large W. Pine stump which agreed with the computed location. On April 26, I searched for evidence with USFS Surveyor K. Whitehorn, USFS technician C. Krause, and Cass County technician T. Freeman. We cut open the W. Pine stump and found the lower blaze with "BT" marks plain. From this stump we set a County Cast Iron Monument using the bearing and distance given by Curo. No evidence was found of the Poplar bearing tree. No evidence was found of the stake set by Curo, the area has been torn up by logging operations. New bearing trees were marked as shown on this certificate. The new trees were all scribed. USFS steel sign posts were set 4.6' south and 5.0' west of the corner.
