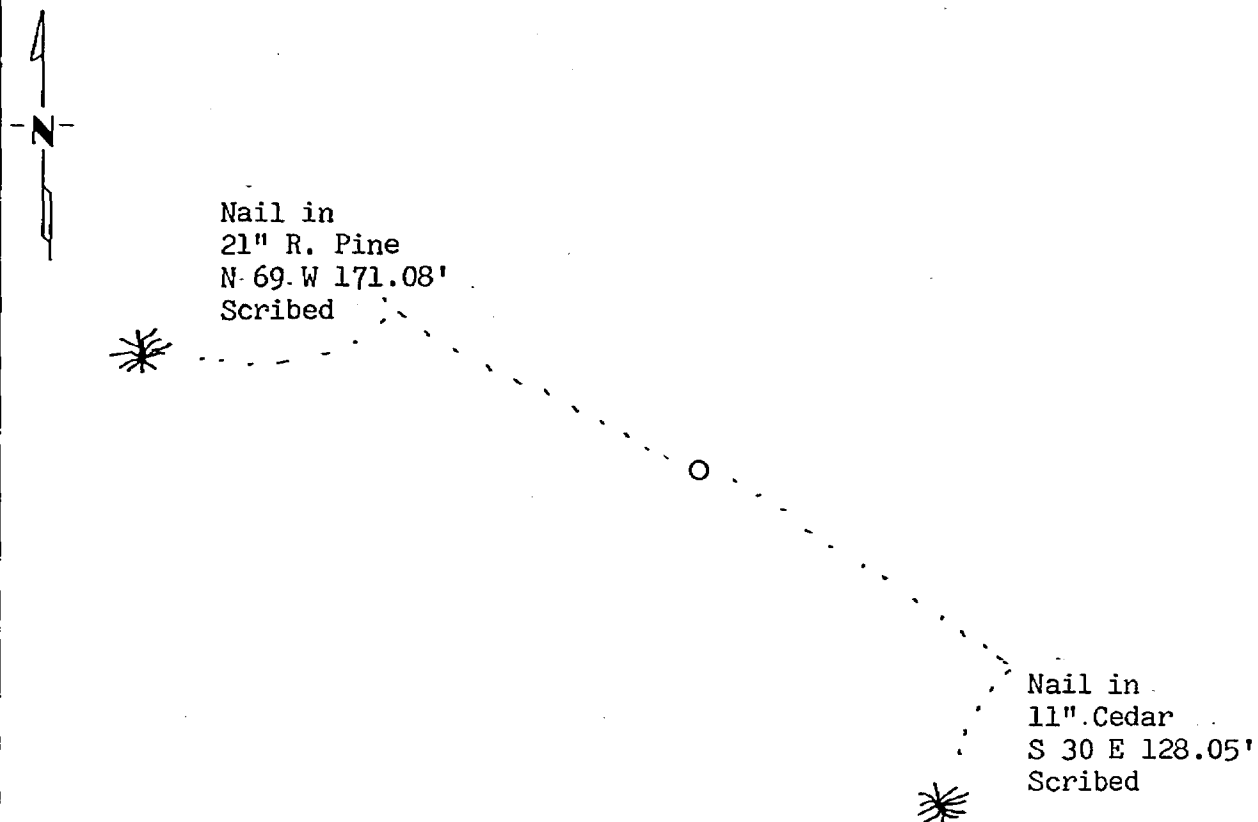

Statement of Evidence:

- 1926 U.S. General Land Office dependent resurvey established this corner and an iron pipe with a marked brass cap was set to mark the corner. The following bearing trees were marked: 10" Maple S 68 E 22 links and 8" W. Pine N 80 W 35 links.
- 1980 U.S. Forest Service technician G. Brama found the corner monumented with a GLO brass cap monument in place in good condition up 12" above ground. The following bearing trees were found: 24" W. Pine stump N 80 W 23.0' and Rotted Maple stump S 68 E 14.5'. Three new bearing trees were marked and are shown on this certificate. Steel sign posts were set 3.1' north and 2.55' south of the corner.
- 1982 County Surveyor's Records in the Recorder's Office were checked and no resurvey information was found on this corner.
- 1982 On Sept. 3 I visited the corner and found items as per the 1980 USFS reports. Accepted monument as marking the same location as when set in 1926 based on bearing tree evidence. One bearing tree marked in 1980 was found as a windfall - 23" W. Pine S 82 E 135.88'.
