Statement of Evidence:

- 1875 U.S. General Land Office survey set wood post for this corner and marked the following bearing trees: 16" R. Oak S 68 W 170 links and 14" Sugar N 60 E 118 links.
- U.S. General Land Office dependent resurvey reestablished this corner by proportionate distance. No evidence was found of the original corner or bearing trees. An iron pipe with a marked brass cap was set to mark the corner. The following bearing trees were marked: 5" Ironwood S 40½ E 10 links and 6" Poplar S 44½ W 21 links.
- U.S. Forest Service technician C. Krause found the corner monumented with a GLO brass capmonument in good condition up 12". The following bearing trees were found: Ironwood snag on ground, well rotted, S 40½ E 6.6' and 14" Aspen with old scar and blaze S 44 W 13.9'. Area is to be clear cut and therefor set steel sign post as witness to monument 5.0' north, south, and west. A 4" x 4" x 5' cedar post was set alongside.
- 1982 County Surveyor's Records in the Recorder's Office were checked and no resurvey information was found on this corner.
- On Sept. 8 I visited the corner and found items as per the 1981 USFS reports. I accepted the monument as marking the same position as when set in 1930 by the GLO resurvey based on the bearing tree evidence.
