## Statement of Evidence:

- 1875 U.S. General Land Office survey set wood post for this corner and marked the following bearing trees: 4" Sugar S 50 E 290 links and 6" Ash S 29 E 261 links.
- U.S. General Land Office dependent resurvey reestablished this corner by proportionate distance. No evidence was found of the original corner or bearing trees. An iron pipe with a marked brass cap was set to mark the corner. The following bearing trees were marked: 8" Elm N 15 E 25 links and 8" Poplar S 32 E 56 links.
- U.S. Forest Service records show the following: CCC record shows brass cap monument and the two 1930 bearing trees found.
- U.S. Forest Service technician G. Brama found GLO brass cap monument in good condition up 6". The following bearing trees were found: 17"

  Poplar S 32 E 37.0' and 16" Elm N 15 E 16.5' cut down and now a 3' high stump. Three new bearing trees were marked and are shown on this certificate. Steel sign posts were set 2.6' north and 3.4' south of the corner.
- 1982 County Surveyor's Records in the Recorder's Office were checked and no resurvey information was found on this croner.
- On Sept. 7 I visited the corner and found items as per the 1981 USFS reports. The 1930 Poplar bearing tree was now a windfall with 4 the snag in place. I accepted the monument as marking the same position as when set in 1930 by the GLO resurvey based on the bearing tree evidence.
