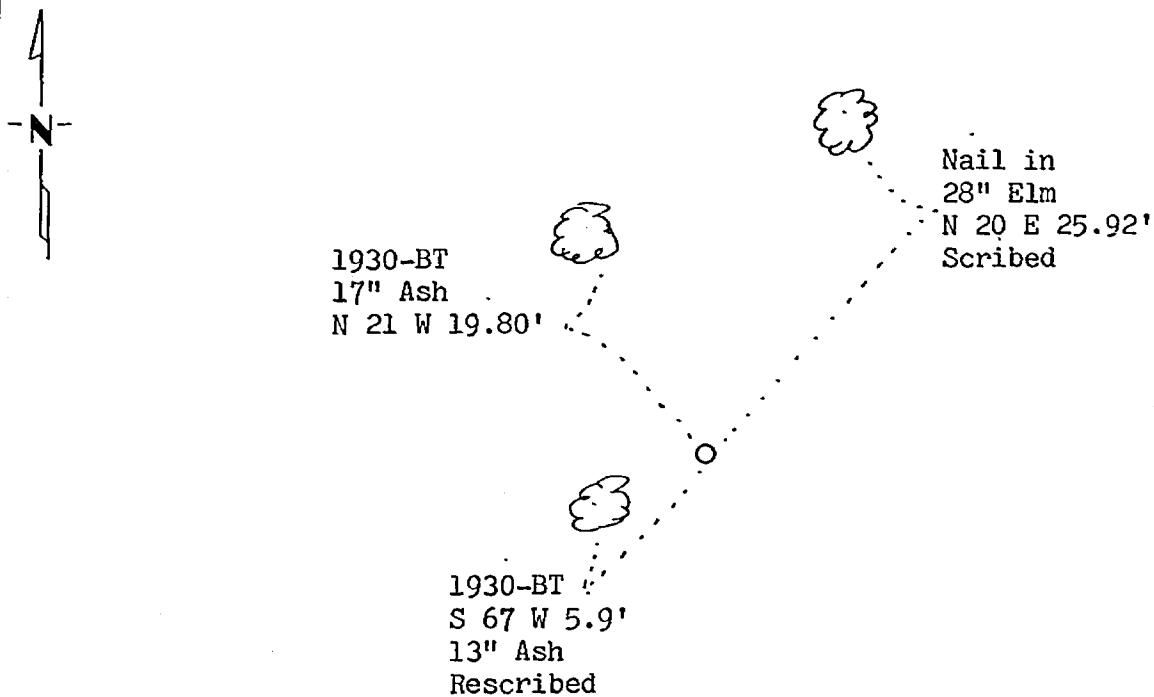

Statement of Evidence:

- 1930 U.S. General Land Office dependent resurvey established this corner. and an iron pipe with a marked brass cap was set to mark the corner. The following bearing trees were marked: 6" Ash S 66 3/4 W 9 links and 7" Ash N 20 3/4 W 30 links.
- 1968 U.S. Forest Service records show the following: L. Martinson found the brass cap monument.
- 1981 U.S. Forest Service technician G. Brama found GLO brass cap monument in good condition up 1.5', but slightly twisted to the NE. The following bearing trees were found: 18" Ash S 67 W 5.9' and 17" Ash N 21 W 19.8'. One new bearing tree was marked and is shown on this certificate. Steel sign posts were set 2.8' north and 3.0' west of the corner.
- 1982 County Surveyor's Records in the Recorder's Office were checked and no resurvey information was found on this corner.
- 1982 Analysis of the above data indicates that the location of this Government corner has been perpetuated. I accepted the monument as marking the corner location as when set in 1930 by the GLO resurvey based on bearing tree evidence.
