

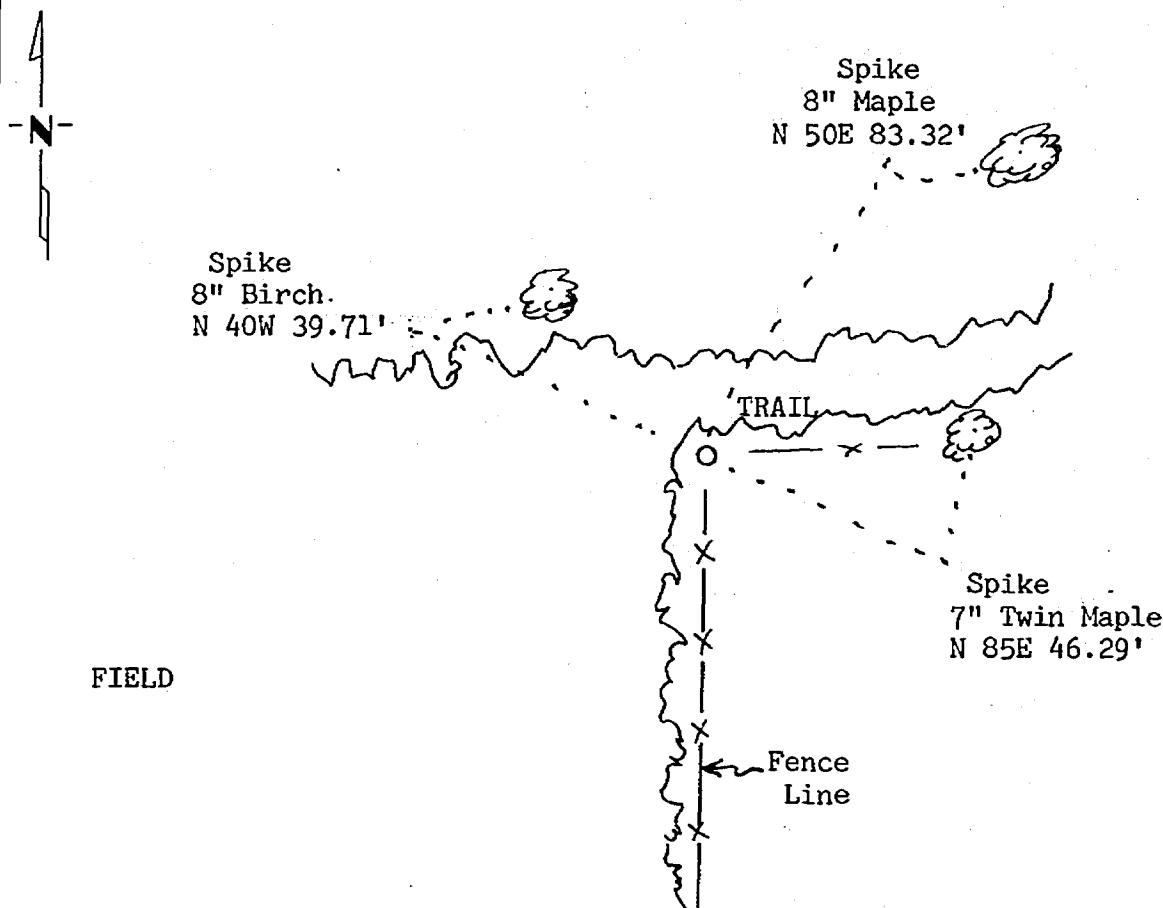

Statement of Evidence:

- 1867 U.S. General Land Office survey set wood post for this corner and marked the following bearing trees: 10" Aspen N 33 $\frac{1}{2}$ W 40 links, 10" Aspen S 48W 20 links, 10" Birch S 49 $\frac{1}{2}$ E 14 links, and 6" Birch N 61 $\frac{1}{2}$ E 35 links.
- 1912 County Surveyor's Record Book A pages 552 to 555 show survey by Harry S. Todd, Deputy County Surveyor. Survey notes show he found only the southwest GLO Aspen plainly marked. The other bearing trees were gone. He set a stake for the corner from the one bearing tree. Two new bearing trees were marked: 12" Birch N 69-15E 9.85' and 14" Poplar N 18-06W 33.00'.
- 1983 Corner area was searched and no evidence was found of a corner marker or of the bearing trees. A fence line runs from the area of the East Quarter corner of Section 11 north to this corner area. An old corner fence post was found at the end of this fence that had rotted off. The distances from the East Quarter corner to the fence corner was found to be 2635 feet. This fence corner was accepted as the obliterated corner position, based on the fence corner being the best possible evidence of the original corner position. A 2" x 2" x 36" steel post with an aluminum cap was set for the corner and ties taken as shown on this certificate.
