

Statement of Evidence:

- 1919 U.S. General Land Office dependent resurvey established this corner and an iron pipe with a marked brass cap was set to mark the corner. The following bearing trees were marked: 8" Ash N 65-15 E 35 links and 4" Ash S 39 E 27 links.
- 1974 U.S. Forest Service records show the following: L. Witthoef found GLO brass cap monument.
- 1980 U.S. Forest Service technician G. Brama found the corner monumented with a GLO brass cap monument in good condition up 12". The following bearing trees were found: Rotted remains of Ash stump N. 65 E 23.1'. No evidence found of other Ash bearing tree. Three new bearing trees were marked and are shown on this certificate.
- 1982 County Surveyor's Records in the Recorder's Office were checked and no resurvey information was found on this corner.
- 1982 Analysis of the above data indicates that the location of this Government corner has been perpetuated. I accepted the monument as marking the corner location as when set in 1919 by the GLO resurvey based on bearing tree evidence.
