

Statement of Evidence:

- 1870 Original Survey: A wood post was set for the North Quarter corner of Section 28 from which the following B.T.'s were marked. A 8" Norway Pine North 60 degrees East 20 LKS. and a 6" Birch South 40 degrees West 40 LKS.
- 1920 Lincoln Mackey, Deputy County Surveyor for Cass County, found a 3"x3" square wood post and the Norway Pine tree and the stump of the Birch. No new B.T.'s were made.
- 1923 John Green and B. B. Bartlett found the wood post and the Norway Pine which was 8" when marked and is now 18". They found no trace of the Birch. No new B.T.'s were made.
- 1924 Ben Clark found the wood post and the North Pine B.T. No new B.T.'s were made.
- 1985 Walter E. Curo, finds the remains of the Norway Pine stump with both the top and bottom blazes showing, but it has been burned so no scribing shows. I set a 2"x2" square Cass County iron pipe monument with aluminum cap south 60 degrees west 13.2 feet from this stump and mark new B.T.'s as shown on the front.
