This corner was originally established in April, 1876, by B.C. Baldwin, Deputy Surveyor. The field notes of that survey are filed in the office of the Secretary of State, St. Paul, Minnesota. Mr. Baldwin's notes state that a post was set to mark the corner and referenced by the following:

A 7" Spruce that bears N51°E a distance of 16 links [10.56 feet]
A 10" Norway Pine that bears S56°E a distance of 34 links [22.44 feet]
A 8"White Pine that bears S52°W a distance of 24 links [15.84 feet]
A 12" Norway Pine that bears N29°W a distance of 30 links [19.80 feet]

On June 14, 1984, personnel from Advance Surveying & Engineering Co. search for this corner position and the above mentioned references but to no avail. However we do find a corner location tag on a Dead Jack Pine, dated 2-21-1942, placed by Van Dolen of the U.S.F.S. This tag states S66°E a distance of 47 links to corner. Also on tag is scratched approx.

On December 14, 1984, we return to this corner position to set a monument. There is now a new Forest Service Road thru this area. We now find a 20" Norway Pine to the Southeast that has a upper and lower blaze. With assistance from the U.S.F.S. we cut open blazes on tree to look for scribing. We can find no trace of scribing although we do find axe marks. We then count growth rings on tree to determine when blazing occured and are able to determine it to be done 42 years ago. We feel these blazes were made by Van Dolen in 1942 while searching for original Bearing Trees and that he did not find any evidence as he placed his corner location tag approximately 200 feet to the North. We then set this corner position by double proportinate method between the Northwest corner of Section 17 and the North Quarter corner of Section 16 and between the Notheast corner of Section 8 and the Southwest corner of Section 16.
