This corner was originally established in April, 1876, by B.C. Baldwin, Deputy Surveyor. The field notes of that survey are filed in the office of the Secretary of State, St. Paul, Minnesota. Mr. Baldwin's notes state that a post was set to mark the corner and referenced by the following:

A 4" Tamarack that bears N18'W a distance of 6 links [3.96 feet]
A 6" Tamarack that bears S35'E a distance of 11 links [7.26 feet]

In 1900, A Map of survey by the Corps of Engineers shows that they found the corner.

On August 3, 1984, personnel from Advance Surveying & Engineering Co. made a thorough search for this corner and the above mentioned references but to no avail. This area is now open Marsh.

On January 12, 1985, an additional search was made by Advance prior to reestablishing this corner position as determined from Corps of Engineers Survey done in 1900. (by obliterated method)
