## Statement of Evidence:

**P5** 

This corner was originally established in April, 1876, by B.C. Baldwin, Deputy Surveyor. The field notes of that survey are filed in the office of the Secretary of State, St. Paul, Minnesota. Mr. Baldwin's notes state that a post was set to mark the corner and referenced by the following:

A 14" Cedar that bears N24°W a distance of 8 links [5.28 feet] A 9" Cedar that bears S78°E a distance of 11 links [7.26 feet]

On June 28, 1984, personnel from Advance Surveying & Engineering Co. made a thorough search for this corner and the above mentioned references but to no avail. This search area is now mixed hardwoods. The Cedar has all been logged off as evidenced by the remaining stumps

On October 12, 1984, an additional search was made by Advance prior to reestablishing this corner at its "lost" position half way and on line between adjacent section corners and as shown on the sketch.
