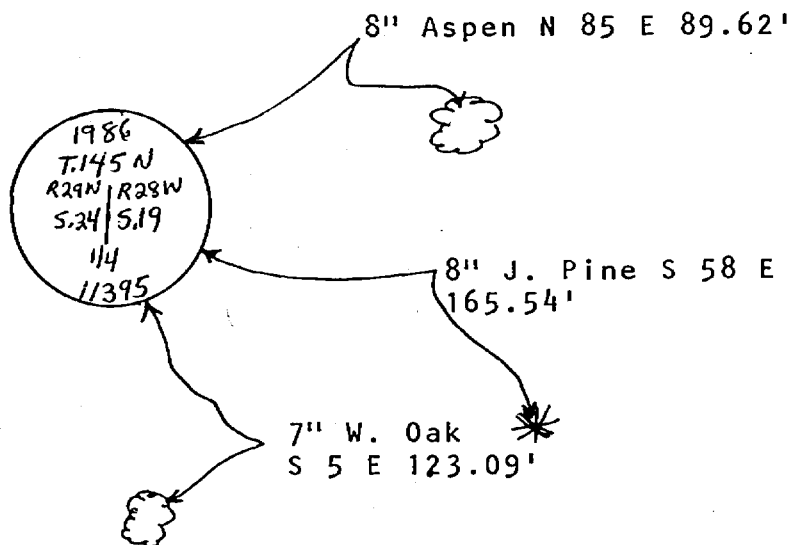
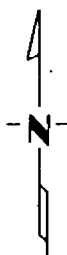

Statement of Evidence: East Quarter Corner Section 24, T. 145 N., R. 29 W.
5th P.M.

- 1873 U.S. Genral Land Office survey set a wood post for this corner and marked the following bearing trees: 7" J. Pine N 13½ E 24 lks., 24" Norway Pine S 74 W 73lks.
- 1968 Bill Okerman, USFS Surveyor, set corner propertionally between the NE and SE Corners of Section 24. He set a 2" x 60" iron pipe with 3" bronze cap and marked new bearing trees: 12" J. Pine N 8 E 45.53', 11" J. Pine N 88W 66.08', 9" Norway Pine S 17 E 92.87'.
- 1979 MN Dept. of Natural Resources survey crew found 2" iron pipe with 3" cap stamped RLS 6807, 1968. They also found an old E-W fence 335' South.
- 1980 David Claypool, RLS, determined that the corner should be set obliterated. Hreset a cast iron monument at a fence corner at corner of old clearing. DNR surveyors and Gary Stevenson, Cass County Surveyor at the time, meet and agree that Claypools position is best.
- 1986 On August 13, Walter E. Curo, finds the cast iron monument set by Claypool and also agrees that this postion is best. Replaced cast iron monument with 2" x 60" galv. iron pipe with brass cap and plastic base with embedded magnet. Mark new bearings: 8" Aspen N 85 E 89.62', 8" J. Pine S 58 E 165.54', 7" White Oak S 5 E 123.09'.
