

STATEMENT OF EVIDENCE

MC 25/36, T. 142 N., R. 29 W., 5th P.M.

- 1874 U.S. General Land Office survey set a wood post for this corner and marked the following bearing trees: 6" W. Ash S 13°E 29 lks., 5" W. Ash N 40°E 67 lks.
- 1918 U.S. General Land Office resurvey set a 1x36" I.P. with marked brass cap and marked the following bearing trees: 6" Maple N 89°E 76 lks., 6" Basswood S 61°15'E 99 lks.
- 1970 R.F. Schneider, private surveyor, found the brass cap monument.
- 1983 County Surveyor, Gary Stevenson, and Survey Technician, Terry Freeman, found the brass cap monument in place, up 6", and possible 1918 GLO BT now a 15" Maple N 89°E 49.71' to a brass disc on N. side of tree.
- 1985 On June 24, County Surveyor, Walt Curo and Survey Technician, Terry Freeman, cut open the possible 1918 GLO BT N 89°E and found the blaze and scribing.
- 1985 On June 26, T. Freeman, Cass County, and Curt Krause and Jeff Allison, USFS survey crew, marked new bearing trees as shown on the front of this certificate. Placed 3 rocks around the monument.
