Statement of Evidence:

During April of 1871, Walker, Allen and Putnam, under contract with the U.S.G.L.O. surveyed and marked the East, North and West lines of Township 141 North, Range 26 West of the 5th Principal Meridian.

From May 1, to May 10, 1871, Walker, Allen and Putnam surveyed and marked the interior lines of the Township.

November 1986, Roger A. Mustonen, RLS #11946 locates 15 inch Tamrach with overgrown blaze, near the north line of the Township and near the west shore of Sand Lake. Removes plug to determine age. Also ties the tree into survey control for other parts of Township line easterly.

In February 1987, I determine the 15 inch Tamrack to be one of the original bearing trees. I set a Cass County monument to perpetuate the corner position.

Original G.L.O. survey set a post, from which: Tamrack 6" N30W 5 links (dead tree still standing) Tamrack 4" SlW 12 links. (no evidence remaining)
