## Statement of Evidence:

During April 1871, Walker, Allen and Putnam, under contract with the U.S.G.L.O., surveyed and marked the East, North and West lines of Township 141 North, Range 26 West of the 5th P.M.

During May of 1871, Walker, Allen and Putnam, Contract Surveyors, surveyed and marked the interior lines of the Township.

During the 1960's, according to local landowners, surveys were made in part of Section 4, for the purpose of laying out lots and marking boundary lines, by unknown surveyors.

A 1935 Minnesota Highway Department right of way map shows a squared 4" X 4" wooden stake at the south quarter corner of Section 4..

During 1977, Roger A. Mustonen, RLS #11946, employed by W.J. Spain, JR & Associates found a 1½" iron pipe monument, along with several blazed trees facing the corner, and accepts same as marking the south quarter corner of Section 4. A 1" iron pipe monument was also found on line at mid-point between this accepted south quarter corner and the southwest corner of Section 4.

On December 30, 1977, the plat of RE-ECHO RIDGE, signed by Roger A. Mustonen, RLS #11946, was recorded by the Cass County Recorder.

On November 20, 1986, Roger A. Mustonen, RLS #11946, under contract with the USDA Forest Service, found a 14" iron pipe monument, along with several blazed trees facing the corner, and accepts same as marking the south quarter corner of Section 4. The half mile from the east measures about 2 chains long. However, the intersection of old roads easterly, southerly and north-northwesterly is at the mid-point between this accepted corner and the southeast corner of Section 4. This found monument is accepted as marking the south quarter corner of Section 4 and on December 22, 1986 was replaced with a USDA Forest Service monument. (See other side for ties, etc.)

Original G.L.O. survey set a wood post, from which: Birch 10" S5°E 18 1ks
Birch 10" N52°W 24 1ks.

No evidence of G.L.O. bearing trees found.
