- 1871 U.S. General Land Office survey set wood post with bearing trees marked: 10" Birch S 10 E 5 links
  8" Birch N 20 W 18 links
- 1937 CCC notes at MN/DNR Washburn Lake Forestry Station show corner found with 2 old scribed N. Pines.
- County Surveyor's Record Book D page 424 show survey by Harold Curo. Survey shows corner and ties found as follows: 30" N. Pine N 35 E 29.3 and 20" N. Pine S 81:-30. W 13.06. Note: Harold Curo surveyed plat of P.F. 6 in Section 9 in 1951, which shows this corner.
- 1974 R.F. Schneider, RLS, found an angle iron marking the corner which agreed with the plat of P.F. 6.
- 1979 We found the angle iron referred to in Schneiders notes.
- We replaced the angle iron with a county cast iron monument and took ties as shown on this certificate. N. Pine bearing trees noted in 1937 and 1953 are still alive. Do not know where these come from, but evidently by old County Surveyor.
