



Statement of Evidence:

- 1874 U.S. General Land Office survey set wood post for this corner and marked the following bearing trees: 14" Tam. S 75 E 54 links and 9" Cedar S 79 W 38 links.
- 1928 U.S. General Land Office dependent resurvey found the corner marked by 3" x 4" cedar stake scribed "1/4 S" on both east and west faces. An iron pipe with a marked brass cap was set to mark the corner. The following bearing trees were marked: 10" Poplar S 75⁰30' W 374 links (246.84 feet).
- 1987 County Surveyor's Records in the Recorder's Office were checked and no resurvey information was found on this corner.
- 1987 U.S. Forest Service office in Cass Lake was contacted for information and no resurvey information was found on this corner.
- 1987 Traversed to corner area based on bearing and distance given in 1928 GLO notes. Found GLO brass cap monument in good condition in open marsh. Also found 1928 GLO bearing tree now 15" dead Poplar snag S 75⁰39' W 246.7 feet to rotten center. New ties taken as shown on this Certificate.
