



Statement of Evidence:

~~NORTH QUARTER CORNER SECTION 13, T139N, R29W~~

- 1865 - The original government survey was run and a post was set to mark this corner.
- 1928 - John Curo, Cass County Surveyor, ran a line from the northwest corner of Section 13 easterly to the location of this corner. From his notes it appears he set a stake at the approximate location of this corner. He made no mention of finding any evidence from the original government survey. This information is from Curo's field Book 156, Pages 47-51.
- 1988 - A Widseth Smith Nolting survey crew made a thorough search of the area and found no evidence of the original government survey or any subsequent surveys. No evidence of the meander corners on Hay Lake to the east, was found either. This corner was established on line and at proportionate measure between the section corners east and west of it. This location fits the approximate meanders of Hay Lake to the east using the measurements from the original government survey.
