Statement of Evidence: Northeast one-sixteenth Corner, Section 12, T.141 N., R.29 W.,
5th P.M.

- 1918 US General Land Office dependent resurvey set a 1"x36" I.P. with marked brass cap for this corner and marked the following bearing trees: 8" Poplar N $82\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E 33 lks., 4" W.Oak S 68° W 30 lks.
- 1987 On July 27, Terry Freeman, Cass County Survey Technician and Curt Krause, US Forest Service, found the GLO monument in good condition up 10". Cass County had previously chained from the east and to the north to other monuments and the distances check well. Corner is at the northeast corner of slope to S & W, near top of ridge. Three large rocks were piled around the monument. Three new bearings were marked as shown on this certificate.
