1873 P. H. Conger, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, originally established this corner position while subdividing Township 141 North, Range 30 West. The notes indicate a wood post was set to mark the corner position and the following witnesses: a 14 inch Tamarack South 68 and 1/2 degrees East a distance of 37 links; a 12 inch Tamarack South 65 degrees West a distance of 72 links; a 13 inch Tamarack North 78 degrees West a distance of 17 links; and a 14 inch Tamarack North 19 degrees East a distance of 70 links.

1912 County Surveyor's Record Book C page 56 show survey by M.A. Kemp and he found a 4 inch by 4 inch by 48 inch post. The post was in a swamp and checked with the stumps of Government bearing trees.

1917 U.S. General Land Office dependant resurvey found the corner marked by the original Northeast, Southeast, and Southwest bearing trees and a wood stake. A 2 inch by 36 inch iron pipe with a marked brass cap was set 36 inches in the ground to mark the corner. The following bearing trees were marked: a 14 inch Red Oak North 53 and 1/2 degrees East a distance of 172 links; a 12 inch Tamarack South 64 and 1/2 degrees West a distance of 189 links; and a 12 inch Tamarack North 66 and 3/4 degrees West a distance of 96 links.

1986 U.S. Forest Service crews set an aerial target over this corner position for determination of coordinate values through the use of GPS on the Chippewa South Boundary Project Cadastral Survey U.S. Project Number 53-6392-8-219. This target allowed for the search and location of this corner.

1988 on June 23 a Landecker-Stevenson & Associates crew visited the corner and found the following evidence: a 2 inch iron pipe with a brass cap monument up 8 inches in old East-West trail in a Tamarack swamp; and both 1917 Tamarack stumps at bearing and distance; and a 8 foot signpost South. Set a 8 foot steel sign post and sign 54-9 North 45 degrees West 6.65 feet. 3 new bearings were marked as shown on front of this certificate.
