1873 P. H. Conger, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, originally established this corner position while subdividing Township 141 North, Range 30 West. The notes indicate a wood post was set to mark the corner position and the following witnesses: a 6 inch Tamarack North 66 degrees East a distance of 17 links; and a 10 inch Tamarack South 77 and 1/2 degrees West a distance of 13 links.

1912 County Surveyor's Record Book C page 55 show survey by M.A. Kemp. He found a 4 inch by 4 inch by 60 inch stake and bearing tree stump South 83 and 1/2 degrees West a distance of 13 links; and dead Tamarack North 63 and 1/2 degrees East a distance of 17 links.

1917 U.S. General Land Office dependant resurvey found the corner marked by Northeast bearing tree stump. A 1 inch by 36 inch iron pipe with a marked brass cap was set 36 inches in ground to mark the corner. The following bearing trees were marked: a 10 inch Cedar South 40 and 1/4 degrees East a distance of 72 links; and a 12 inch Cedar North 51 degrees East a distance of 56 links.

1986 U.S. Forest Service records show the following: set rerod from ties of 1917 General Land Office stumps. New ties: a 6 inch Ash stub North 76 degrees West a distance of 28.12 feet; a 8 inch Birch North 35 degrees West a distance of 41.65 feet; and a 9 inch Balm of Gilead North 52 degrees East a distance of 51.70 feet.

1986 U.S. Forest Service crews set an aerial target over this corner position for determination of coordinate values through the use of GPS on the Chippewa South Boundary Project Cadastral Survey U.S. Project Number 53-6392-8-219. This target allowed for the search and location of this corner.

1988 on July 21 a Landecker-Stevenson & Associates crew set a 2 inch by 24 inch brass cap in place of rerod. Checked ties to rerod from 1917 stumps (good). There is an 8 inch rerod in base of monument. Corner is located in North edge of old East-West road. 1986 Balm of Gilead bearing tree is dying; 1986 Birch 8 inch North 35 degrees West a distance of 41.65 feet in good condition. New tie: a 7 Inch Ash North 45 degrees East a distance of 55.15 feet; and a 6 inch Balsam South 28 degrees West a distance of 39.42 feet. Set 8 foot signpost East 5.0 feet with signs 54-2 and 54-9.
