- 1873 P. H. Conger, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, originally established this corner position while subdividing Township 141 North, Range 29 West. The notes indicate a wood post was set to mark the corner position and the following witnesses: an 8 inch Poplar North 21 degrees East a distance of 17 links; and a 20 inch White Pine South 18 degrees West a distance of 13 links.
- 1937 U.S. Forest Service records show the following: J.A. Ghelhaug, for tower survey, establishes corner at lost single proportion position between Northeast and Northwest Corners of said Section 29.
- 1964 U.S. Forest Service records show the following: found 1 and 1/2 inch pipe.
- 1981 U.S. Forest Service records show the following: found 1 and 1/2 inch pipe.
- 1984 County Surveyor's Record show survey by Freeman and Hummitzsch. They found 2 inch iron pipe and U.S. Forest Service corner tag; no original evidence.
- 1986 U.S. Forest Service crews set an aerial target in the vicinity of this corner for the search and establishment of the true corner position. The target having coordinate values through the use of GPS on the Chippewa South Boundary Project Cadastral Survey U.S. Project Number 53-6392-8-219. This target allowed for the search and location of this corner.
- 1988 on July 1 a Landecker-Stevenson & Associates crew visited the corner and found the following evidence: a 1 and 1/2 inch iron pipe reported by others, South 7 and 1/2 degrees East a distance of 41.7 feet from the lost position as determined in the 1937 USFS survey by Ghelhaug. No evidence of original bearing trees. Mathematical comparisions using found monument in Section 20 as surveyed by Ghelhaug indicate this monument is not that as determined by Ghelhaug. This monument was not accepted as the quarter corner.
- 1988 on July 26 a Landecker-Stevenson & Associates crew set a 2 inch by 48 inch iron pipe with brass cap at single proportion position between the Northeast and the Northwest corners of Section 29. 3 bearing trees are shown on front of this certificate, two 8 foot steel sign posts are in place as noted.
