1873 P. H. Conger, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, originally established this corner position while subdividing Township 141 North, Range 30 West. The notes indicate a wood post was set to mark the corner position and the following witnesses: a 30 inch White Pine North 14 and 1/2 degrees East a distance of 123 links; and a 30 inch White Pine South 76 degrees East a distance of 56 links.

1914 County Surveyor's Record Book B pages 516-520 show survey by James Middleton. He set a wood hub from old Government bearing trees, a stump and a stub.

1917 U.S. General Land Office dependant resurvey found the corner marked by stumps of both original bearing trees and old wood stake.

1964 U.S. Forest Service records show the following: Ekstrom searched for corner, found nothing.

1973 U.S. Forest Service records show the following: C. Krause searched for corner, found nothing.

1986 U.S. Forest Service crews set an aerial target in the vicinity of this corner for the search and establishment of the true corner position. The target having coordinate values through the use of GPS on the Chippewa South Boundary Project Cadastral Survey U.S. Project Number 53-6392-8-219. This target allowed for the search and location of this corner.

1988 on July 15 a Landecker-Stevenson & Associates crew searched for the corner using compass and chain to determine search area. The following information was found: position falls east of east edge of Forest Service Trail Number 3759 B. No evidence of post or White Pine bearing trees.

1988 on September 15 a Landecker-Stevenson & Associates crew set a 2 inch by 54 inch iron pipe with brass cap and plastic base with magnet at the proportional position developed from the 1917 General Land Office notes and maps. This position also compares well with the location as measured in the 1914 County survey.

3 new bearing trees are shown on front of this certificate, steel sign post is in place as noted.
