1870 Orville Smith, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, subdivided Township 140 North, Range 29 West. No Quarter corner was established in his survey.

1915 County Surveyor's Record Book C page 243 show survey by F.A. Donner. He set 2 inch by 48 inch galvanized iron pipe with cap proportionally between the Northwest corner of Section 2 and Meander Corner on the North line of Section 1.

1915 County Resurvey Record Cabinet E, Number 23 shows survey by John Curo. Plat shows a 2 and 1/2 inch by 48 inch iron monument, that being the same as previously established.

1965 U.S. Forest Service records show the following: found remains of 1915 Curo survey and his 2 inch iron monument. The USFS set a 2 inch by 5 foot iron pipe with bronze cap; a 6 foot sign post East 5.1 feet; a 3 inch Ash South 10 degrees West a distance of 43.6 feet; and a 9 inch Oak South 75 degrees West a distance of 31.6 feet.

1988 on June 22 a Landecker-Stevenson & Associates crew visited the corner and found the following evidence: Forest Service bronze cap monument with 2 inch County capped iron pipe on the Southeast side; and a 6 foot sign post East 5.15 feet. It was determined that this pipe fit the monumentation as established by the County in 1915. New bearing trees were marked as shown and a steel sign post is in place as noted on front of this certificate.
