

Statement of Evidence:

R-25

Northeast Corner, Section 25, T.134N., R.31W., 5th P.M.

- 1858 U.S. General Land Office survey set a wood post for this corner and marked the following bearing trees: a 36" Pine N33W 26 links, 24" Pine N54E 31 links, a 20" Pine S53W 42 links, and a 10" Burr Oak S10E 21 links.
- 1907 County Survey Record Book "A", pages 50-51, show a survey by John Curo. He set an 8"x 8"x 36" stone from using the the old northeast, southwest, and southeast government bearing trees.
- 1985 On November 4, Cass County Survey Technician Terry Freeman checked the Cass County Highway plans for County State Aid Highway #34. He found that the plans show a 2-3' fill in the area of the corner.
- 1986 On July 2, Terry Freeman, backhoe operator Glen Williams, and two people from Comstock and Davis found an 8" square stone with the top broken off and its base in concrete down 2.8'. The corner is 11' south of the centerline of the east to west road in line with the centerlines of roads to the north and south. They set a cast iron monument over the stone with the top down 0.1'.
- 1986 On September 17, Terry Freeman marked the bearing trees shown on the front of this certificate.
