

CERTIFICATE OF LOCATION OF GOVERNMENT CORNER


Northeast. Corner of Section 4, Township 133N., Range 31W, 5th P.M.

Northeast Corner, Section 4, T.133N., R.31W., 5th P.M.

- 1858 U.S. General Land Office survey set a wood post for this corner and marked the following bearing trees: a 6" Aspen S6E 71 links, 12" Aspen S30W 11 links, an 8" Aspen N6W 20 links, and a 10 Aspen N30E 106 links.
- 1907 County Survey Record Book "A", pages 4-5, show a survey done by John Curo. He set an 8"x 8"x 36" stone. For bearing trees he used a Poplar stump 6" size N51-30W 42.50' and the highest peak rock 3' tall S21-45E 17.30'.
- 1985 On November 7, Cass County Survey Technician Terry Freeman and backhoe operator Glen Williams found the 8" square stone laying down north of the point of intersection of a cement "L". The cement "L" is pointing south and east. The stone was layed on top of the east part of the "L" with the slightly pointed end at the corner.
- 1986 On September 18, Terry Freeman placed a cast iron monument down 6", 5' west of the centerline of the north to south road, and in line with the road going west and in line with the fence to the east.
