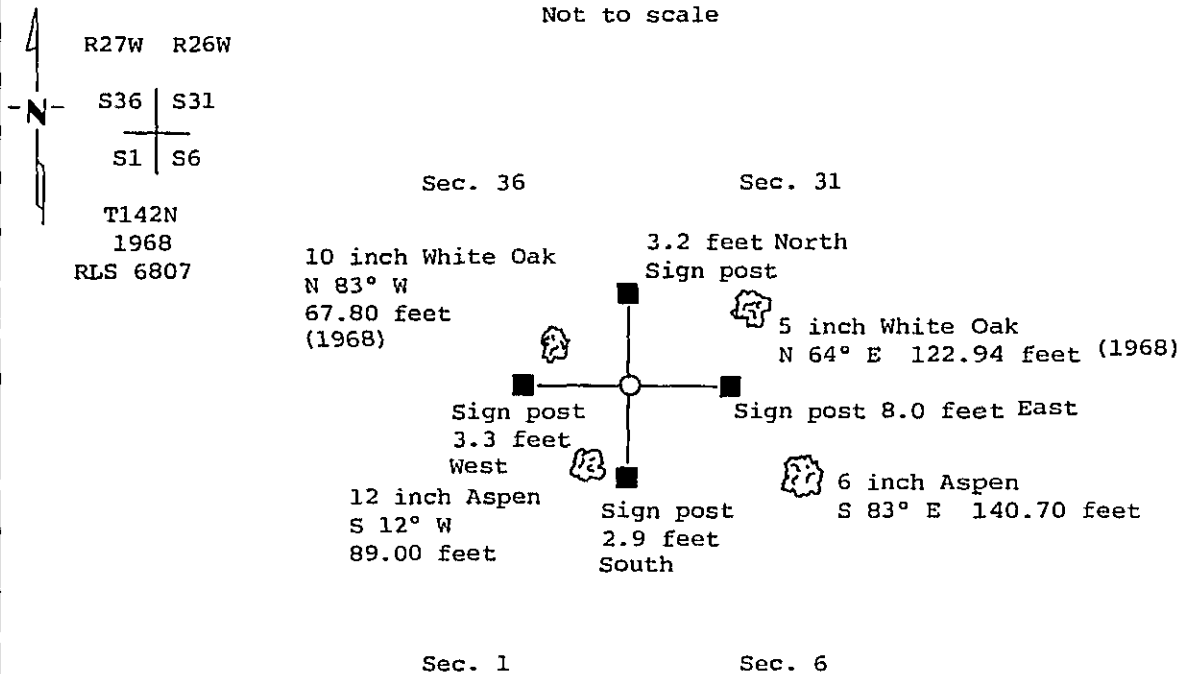

Cedar 6" N 59 degrees W, 8 Links (fallen)  
set cedar post and added the following witnesses:  
Balm of Gilead 9" S 59 degrees E, 236 Links (155.76)
- 1963 Bob McDonald, USFS, found cedar post (1937) and following:
