1871 George Stuntz, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, originally established this corner position while running the West line of Township 142 North, Range 31 West. The notes indicate a wood post was set to mark the corner position and the following witnesses: a 15 inch Yellow Pine South 85 degrees East a distance of 6 links.

1916 Cass County Surveyor's records on mircofilm roll 11 S, Book 86, page 18-19 show a survey by F.F. Wilson. The original wood post and Southeast bearing tree were found.

1935 Civilian Conservation Corps, D.J. Sutton, field assistant, found 2 inch County iron pipe in good condition up 14 inches. He places a metal location poster on a 20 inch White Pine South 15 degrees East a distance of 30 links.

1937 Civilian Conservation Corps, Carl Steadland, Foreman, found 2 inch County iron pipe in good condition up 15 inches. He also found the metal location poster as placed by Sutton in 1935.

1987 United States Forest Service personnel find 1 and 1/2 inch iron pipe up 18 inches and original Pine stump South 78 degrees East a distance of 4.0 feet with blaze and scribe visible and the CCC bearing tree now a 29 inch White Pine South 15 degrees East a distance of 18.25 feet. They place a rock ring around pipe and mark new bearing trees: a 21 inch Norway Pine North 9 degrees West a distance of 89.90 feet; and a 7 inch Tamarack South 80 degrees East a distance of 53.25 feet. Corner is 40 feet, more or less, west of Tamarack swamp on side hill in Pine and Hardwoods.

1991 on January 10, a Landecker & Associates, Inc. survey crew find a 1 and 1/2 inch County iron pipe and 1987 USFS tie while traversing west line of the township.

1991 on February 9, a Landecker & Associates, Inc. survey crew place an aluminum cap over the 1 and 1/2 inch iron pipe. Note original Pine stump South 85 degrees East a distance of 3.96 feet. The 1987 USFS bearing trees are inplace as shown. A steel sign post was set as noted on front of this certificate.
