Statement of Evidence:

East Quarter corner, Section 20, Township 141 North, Range 31 North, Cass County, Minnesota

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1873 P.H. Conger, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, originally established this corner position while subdividing Township 141 North, Range 31 West. The notes indicate that he set a wood post and marked the following bearing trees: an 8 inch Norway Pine North 74 degrees East a distance of 70 links (46.20 feet); and an 11 inch Norway Pine North 71 degrees West a distance of 31 links (20.46 feet).

1962 on May 2, United States Forest Service notes for Township 141 North, Range 31 West in Book 1, page 74, show that R.H. McDonald searched for the corner and found no original evidence.

1975 on May 30, R.F. Schneider, Licensed Land Surveyor Number 5740, searched for corner and found no evidence. His notes in his Book 37, page 51, show that he set a spike at the single proportion position and marked the following bearing trees: a 10 inch Birch North 22 degrees East a distance of 11.10 feet; a 5 inch White Oak South 26 degrees East a distance of 54.81 feet and a 10 inch Red Oak South 19 degrees West a distance of 41.79 feet.

1992 on July 28, a Landecker & Associates of Walker, Inc., survey crew found the 1975 Schneider spike and ties.
1992 on November 17, a Landecker & Associates of Walker, Inc., survey crew set a 2 inch by 48 inch iron monument with brass cap up 14 inches at the lost, single proportion position between the Northwest and Southwest corners of Section 21 (see note below). New bearing trees were marked as shown and steel sign posts set as noted on front of this certificate.

Note: This corner position is different than that established by R.F. Schneider in 1975 due to the recovery of the obliterated position of the true original corner at the Northwest corner of Section 21, which Schneider had previously established by double proportion methods.
