STATEMENT ON EVIDENCE

Northwest Corner of Section 06, Township 145 North, Range 31 West of the 5th Principal Meridian.

In 1871, Geo. R. Stuntz, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, set a post to mark the corner and recorded four bearing trees as accessories; an 18" Yellow Pine, N33°W 93 links; a 15" Yellow Pine, S08°W 73 links; a 9" Black Pine, S46°E 73 links; an 8" Black Pine, N75°E 127 links.

In 1874, Allen and Barnes, U.S. Deputy Surveyors ran the south line of T 146 N, R 32 W and found 1871 monument and BTs.

In 1875, Benjamin C. Baldwin, U.S. Deputy Surveyor ran the south line of T 146 N, R 31 W and found 1871 monument and BTs.

1900-1904, U.S. Army Corp of Engineers map for the Lake Winnibigoshish Reservoir shows comer was found, the surveyor listed is T. Milton Fowble. A copy of the map is on file in the Cass County Survey Department.

In 1917, C.C. Spencer, Deputy County Surveyor, surveyed for a judicial road in this area. He found remains of three original bearing trees. He also found an iron pipe recorded by Curo. He recorded two additional bearing trees: a 5" Jack Pine, N77-1/2" W 36.1 feet; a 4" Jack Pine, S61°W 50.3 feet. Information on file in Beltrami County Surveyors office FB 170257

In 1932, H. Craig, United States Cadastral Engineer, made a dependent resurvey of Section 36, T146N, R32W. He found remains of three original bearing trees: a Pine stump, N76-1/2°E 127 links; an 18" Norway Pine, S08°W 73 links; a 16" Pine stump, N34-3/4°W 92 links. He also found the capped iron post recorded by Spencer in 1917. He removed the capped iron post and set a marked brass cap in a cement monument to mark the corner and reset the capped iron post alongside and recorded four additional bearing trees: a 7" Jack Pine, N44°E 48 links; a 7" Jack Pine, S60-1/2°E 68 links; a 6" Jack Pine, S51-1/2°W 72 links; an 8" Jack Pine, N56-3/4°W 79 links. Information on file in Cass County Surveyors office.

In 1939, The Civilian Conservation Corps was actively running section lines and remonumenting Public Land Survey Corners in this area. They found the marked brass cap in cement monument with the capped iron post alongside and the four bearing trees as recorded by Craig in 1932; an 8" Jack Pine, N64°W 51.8 feet; an 8" Jack Pine, S44°W 47.3 feet; a 9" Jack Pine, S68-1/2°E 44.5 feet; an 8" Jack Pine, N37°E 31.6 feet. Information on file in Beltrami County CCC Book 23A Page 106.

On May 7, 1980, A. Larson and F. Bydlon of the Beltrami County Remonumentation Crew searched for public land Survey Corners in this area. They found the marked brass cap in a cement monument with the capped iron post alongside and remains of two bearing trees as recorded by Craig in 1932: a Jack Pine stump, N44°E 32.20 feet; a Jack Pine stump, S60°W 50.45 feet. They also set new ties; a 5" Red Oak, S52°E 61.91 feet: an 8° Red Oak, S42°W 30.43 feet: a 5° Burr Oak, N30°W 52.20 feet: a 10° Red Oak, N21°E 27.29 feet. All B.T.'s were blazed and scribed "B.T.". An analysis of the above data indicates the location of the Public Land Survey Corner as having been perpetuated by the marked brass cap in a cement monument as recorded by Craig in 1932. Information on Beltrami County comer card

In 1997, The Hubbard County Surveyors office visits the corner and places a tag on the 1980 B.T.'s N30°W and N21°E and places a tag on a new B.T. 10" Oak, N10°W 73.24 feet.

In December 2010, a Northern Engineering & Consulting survey crew found a 3 1/2" diameter brass GLO disc in a 6 " concrete monument, flush with surface grade. Three existing ties were found and one new tie was set as shown on the front page of this certificate. The brass cap monument is accepted as a perpetuation of the original comer position.
