

STATEMENT OF EVIDENCE: Witness Corner to Meander Corner #3 between Sections 31 and 6, T145-146N, R27 West of the 5th Principal Meridian.

1873 The meander corner was established by P.H. Conger, Deputy Surveyor, in the township boundary survey. His notes indicate a post was placed at the meander corner and established witnesses as follows:

Cedar 24" S53E 130 links (85.80 feet)

Cedar 10" S81E 139 links (91.74 feet)

1900 The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Lake Winnibigoshish Reservoir map does not indicate the meander corner to be a known corner.

2011 Personnel from Short Elliott Hendrickson did not search for the original monument. It was determined to be in the Lake Winnibigoshish Reservoir approximately 600 feet west of the current shoreline.

The corner was positioned by projecting a straight line from the northeast corner of Section 5 through the northeast corner of Section 6, the nearest recovered corners, to intersect the bank above the Lake Winnibigoshish Reservoir. The meander corner position was positioned at record distance in the lake. A witness corner to the meander corner was set and witnesses were made as shown on the face of this certificate. An analysis of the record information and field evidence supports this monument as the best evidence of the corner position.
