





Statement of Evidence

**Southeast corner of Section 35, Township 139 North, Range 27 West, 5th Principal Meridian.**

- 1863 The US General Land Office, in notes of running the south line of Township 139 North, Range 27 West, set a post for the original corner and referenced it as follows:  

5" Tamarack	N 19° E	49 links	3" Tamarack	S 57° E	17 links
4" Tamarack	S 27° W	27 links	6" Tamarack	N 5° W	50 links

Said records are on file with the Minnesota Historical Society, St. Paul, Minnesota, copies are filed with the Cass County Surveyor's Office (CCSO).
  
- 1913 Harry Todd, Deputy County Surveyor, Survey Record Number 230, Book A, page 579, on file in the CCSO, indicates a stake was set, stating, "we find all four plainly marked from which we set a 3x3x30 inch stake". The following witness trees were made:  

4" Tamarack	N 48° W	41.50 feet	4" Tamarack	N 49°40' E	57.90 feet
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- 1936 CCC Washburn Lake field book 7, page 1, on file at the DNR office in Brainerd show CCC personnel found a 2" square stake in place with scribing and the following bearing trees:  

3" Dead Tam.	N 43° E	88 links	B.T.	S 65° E	14.5 links
3" Tam. Stump	N 54°30' W	62.5 links	10" W. Pine w/yellow tag	N 11° E	108.5 links

KLJ attempts to locate the CCC field books or copies were unsuccessful.
  
- 1939 CCC Washburn Lake field book 10, page 13, on file at the DNR office in Brainerd show CCC personnel found a 4" Pine stake, square on all four sides with a yellow tag on the north side. Stakes in original bearing trees NE and NW.
  
- 2008 Don Sigety, LS 23945, Book 128, Page 24, certificate #1348, on file in the Crow Wing County Surveyor's Office, set a 2"x2"x3' square tube monument with a stamped aluminum cap and filed a certificate of location in Crow Wing County, and is referenced by the following:  

16" Aspen	N 54° W	8.0 feet	7" Basswood	N 58° E	33.3 feet
15" Oak	S 28° W	35.1' feet			
  
- 2013 A KLJ survey crew found a 2" square tube with an aluminum cap, and is witnessed with the ties shown on the front of this certificate. Jarrett Leas, RLS #42619, after analysis of record and survey information accepts this monument as the correct perpetuation of the corner.
