## **Statement of Evidence**

Northeast corner, Section 14, Township 135 North, Range 30 West, 5<sup>th</sup> Principal Meridian, Cass County, Minnesota

1869 – Original U.S. Government Survey establishing this corner was performed. A wood post was set marking its location from which the following witnesses were established:

| 11" Aspen   | S 1° E    | 850 links |
|-------------|-----------|-----------|
| 14" B. Pine | N 2° E    | 700 links |
| 16" B. Pine | S 1 ½ ° W | 725 links |
| 12" B. Pine | N 34° E   | 685 links |

Records on file with the Secretary of State and copies are in the Cass County Highway Department/Surveyor's Office (CCHD/SO).

1916 – As recorded in Curo Field Book 56, pages 64-67 and in Survey Record 315, County Survey Record Book B, pages 374-376, John Curo recovered the SW witness as shown above as used it to set 2" x 48" iron at true corner and established the following witnesses:

Oak Post S 45° E 46.70 feet Oak Post S 45° W 46.70 feet

1920 – Lincoln Mackey found iron monument as recorded in County Survey Record Book C, p. 375.

2013 – Patrick Trottier, PLS 41002, found a 2" iron pipe, accepted it as corner, and established the witnesses as shown on the front of this certificate.
