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STATEMENT OF EVIDENCE

Northeast Corner of Sec. 22, T.143N., R.30W., 5th P.M., Cass County, MN

1875 B.C. Baldwin, U.S. General Land Office (GLO), originally established this corner while surveying the subdivision lines of this township, and set a wood post to mark the corner position with the following witnesses:

14" Maple	N73.5°E	40 links (26.40')
15" Maple	N14.5°W	57 links (37.62')
6" Elm	S80'W	19 links (12.54')
10" Maple	S78°E	22 links (14.52')

- 1916 J.W. Curo (Curo Book 55, Page 23, CCSO Records) found all four bearing trees plainly marked, except for the SE BT, which was a stump, and also found the point of the old stake. A new hub was set and bearing trees were checked and found to be accurate. The hub was later replaced during this survey with a 2"x48" iron pipe monument.
- 1924 E.G. Harrington, U.S. General Land Office, during a dependent resurvey of this township found a 2" galvanized iron pipe, 12" above ground and set an iron post monument north and alongside iron pipe, with the following ties noted:

- 2002 T. Freeman, on the plat of NI GIG WAH NOE SHORES (Doc. A000459898, Cass County Recorder's Office), indicates a brass cap monument found at this corner.
- 2007 B. Skipton, on the plat of NI GIG WAH NOE SHORES FIRST ADDITION (Doc. A000529829, Cass County Recorder's Office), indicates a GLO brass monument found at this corner.
- 2021 A. Skattum, Cass County Surveyor, (CCSO Project #2021.025) found a 2" o.d. iron pipe, up 12", with a GLO iron post and brass cap alongside north. Both monuments were in good condition and as described in the 1924 GLO notes. The uncapped pipe was accepted as being a direct perpetuation of the original GLO corner, and the following ties were noted:
