Whereas, Upon the petition of 8 legal voters who own real estate or who occupy real estate under the homestead or pre-emption laws of the United States, or under contract from the State of Minnesota, within three (3) miles of the road proposed in said petition to be Sead Creek; which said petition was filed with the Town Clerk, who forthwith presented it to us for action thereon, and which said proposed road is set forth

and described in said petition as follows, viz: Beginning at the road end of the road now established on the township line between Sead & Bey Steake townships and continue west to the corner of lots 2 & 8 Sec 5 of T. 142 R. 28 and east 3 Sec. 39 Townships 143. R. 28

And Whereas, Upon receiving said petition, we did, within thirty days thereafter, make out an order or notice of hearing and fix therein a time and place at which we would meet and act upon said petition, to-wit: On the 19 day of Dec 1933, at Chaska Office

causing copies of such notice to be posted in three public places in said Town, at least ten days before such meeting; and having met at such time and place as above named in said notice, and being satisfied that the petitioners had, at least ten days previous to said time caused said notice of time and place of hearing to be given to all the occupants of the land through which such road might pass, by serving the same personally upon each of said occupants, proof of which was shown by affidavit, we proceeded to examine personally such road, and heard all persons interested, and any and all reasons for or against the road

the same, and being of opinion that such road was necessary and proper, and that the public interest would be promoted thereby, we granted the prayer of said petitioners and determined to lay out said road, and caused a survey thereof to be made according to the report and plat herewith accompanying, the description of which as so is as follows, to-wit: Beginning

at the road end of the road now established on the township line between Sead & Bey Steake townships and continue west to the corner of lots 2 & 8 Sec. 5. of T. 142 R. 28 and east 3 Sec. 39. R. 28

It is Therefore Ordered and Determined, That a road be, and the same is hereby laid out and established according to the description last aforesaid, and the report and plat herewith accompanying which is hereby made a part of this Order, and it is declared to be a public road. 4 rods wide, the said description above given being the center of said road.

Whereas, A road was laid out..... on the 19 day of Aug 1933, by us, the Supervisors of the said Town of Berry Lake on the petition of leg legal voters who own real estate or who occupy real estate under the homestead or pre-emption laws of the United States, or under contract from the State of Minnesota, within three (3) miles of said road, which said road.....

is set forth and described in the foregoing Supervisors' Order, made by us, and Whereas, A part of the damages sustained by reason of the laying out..... said road has been ascertained by the agreement of the owners of the lands through which said road passes, with us, and a part of the owners of the said lands have in writing released all claims to damages; but not being able to agree with the owners of the following described lands, claiming damages by reason of said road passing through, and the owners of some of the said lands being unknown, we have assessed the damages to each of such individual claimants with whom we could not agree, and awarded damages to the owners of such lands through which such road passes as are unknown, at what we deemed just and right; taking into account and estimating the benefits the road will confer on the claimants and owners, as well as the disadvantages. NOTICE TO BIDDERS FOR ROAD CONSTRUCTION.

Sealed bids will be received by the board of county commissioners at Walker, Minn., up to 2 o'clock April 4th, 1916, for the turnpiking of highland and grading of swamp on county road No. 16 on the east lines of sections 12, 13 and 24, township 144, range 26.

The turnpiking on highland will be 24 feet wide with one foot crown. In the swamp the roadway will be 12 feet wide and will require about 50 cubic yards of gradine to the station; the material to be taken from highland and borrow ditches as directed by Commissioner Swarberg.

Bids will be received for turnpiking per station (100 feet) and for grading per cubic yard, flat price.

Deposit—A certified check of \$50.00, payable to the county auditor, is required from each bidder conditioned that if his bid is accepted, he will enter into a contract for the construction of the work.

Board—Full value of contract payment—Monthly to the extent of 80 per cent of the engineer's estimate of the work accomplished.

Work to be completed September 1st, 1916.
