A form of the return to be signed by you is appended in this book.

Extracts from Laws Relating to the Listing of Personal Property.

(Section Numbers Refer to General Statutes, 1923.)

Sec. 1974. PROPERTY SUBJECT TO TAXATION. All Real and Personal Property in this State and all Personal Property of persons residing therein, \* \* \* is taxable, except such as is by law exempt from taxation.

WHEN LISTED AND ASSESSED.

Sec. 1984. \* \* \* Personal Property shall be listed and assessed annually with reference to its value on May 1, and, if acquired on that day, shall be listed by or for the person acquiring it.

Sec. 1989. If when listed, Personal property shall be listed in the manner following:

- 1. Every person of full age and sound mind, being a resident of this state, shall list all his moneys, credits, bonds, shares of stock, and other property, and all real estate in which he has an interest, money loaned or invested, annuities, franchises, royalties, and other personal property.
2. He shall also list accurately, and in the name of his principal or other person controlled by him, all the real estate, land, or other personal property which he owns, or in which he has an interest, and all moneys, credits, bonds, shares of stock, and other property due from or owing by any person, company or corporation.
3. The property of a minor child or insane person shall be listed by his guardian, or by the person having such property in charge.
4. The property of a person for whose benefit it is held in trust, or the property of a decedent, shall be listed by the executor or administrator.
5. The property of a partnership whose assets are in the hands of a receiver, by such receiver.
6. The property of a body politic or corporate, by the proper agent or other thereof.
7. The property of a firm or company, by a partner or agent thereof.
8. The property of manufacturers and others in the hands of a receiver, by such agent in the name of his principal, as mentioned in section 1989.
9. Sec. 1993. Where listed. Except as otherwise in this section provided, personal property shall be listed and assessed in the town or district in which the person owning or possessing the same resides, or in which the same is situated in several towns or districts, it shall be listed in the town or district in which the principal place of business of the person owning or possessing the same is situated.

Sec. 1994. Lists to be returned. All household goods and furniture, including electric, mechanical, plumbing, and other personal property, shall be listed and assessed in the town or district in which the person owning or possessing the same resides, or in which the same is situated in several towns or districts, it shall be listed in the town or district in which the principal place of business of the person owning or possessing the same is situated.
Sec. 1995. Personal property of electric light and power companies. Personal property of electric light and power companies shall be listed and assessed in the town or district in which the principal place of business of the company is situated.
Sec. 1996. Personal property of electric light and power companies. Personal property of electric light and power companies shall be listed and assessed in the town or district in which the principal place of business of the company is situated.

Sec. 2001. Personal property of decedent. The personal property of a decedent shall be listed and assessed in the town or district in which the principal place of business of the decedent was situated at the time of his death.
Sec. 2015. Reversion under guardianship. The personal property of a minor under guardianship shall be listed and assessed in the town or district in which the principal place of business of the guardian is situated, where the ward resides.

Sec. 2016. Assignees and receivers. Personal property in the hands of an assignee or receiver shall be listed and assessed in the place of listing before his appointment.

Section 1986. General Statutes of Minnesota, 1923. The county auditor shall annually provide the necessary assessment books and blanks at the expense of the county, for and to correspond with each assessment district. He shall make out, in the real property assessment book, complete lists of all lands and lots subject to taxation, showing the names of the owners, if to him known, and, if unknown, so stated opposite each tract or lot, the number of acres, and the lots or parts of lots, or blocks included in each description of property. The list of real property becoming subject to assessment and taxation every odd numbered year may be appended to the real property assessment book.

The assessors shall meet at the office of the auditor, on the first Monday of each year, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, for the purpose of receiving instructions as to their duties under the law of this state.

Each assessor attending such meetings shall receive as compensation for such services the sum of four dollars per day for each day necessarily consumed in and returning from the county seat at the rate of five cents per mile for each mile necessarily traveled in going from his home to and returning from the county seat to be computed by the usually traveled route and paid out of the county treasury upon the warrant of the county auditor.

Sec. 1997. Property moved between May and July. The owner of personal property, remaining from one county, town, or district to another, shall be listed in the county, town, or district in which it is first called upon by the assessor. A person moving his property from one county, town, or district to another, shall be assessed in the county, town, or district in which he is first called upon by the assessor.

Sec. 2015. Where listed in case of doubt. In case of doubt as to the proper place of listing personal property or where it cannot be listed in any one county, town, or district, the assessor shall list it in the county, town, or district in which it is first called upon by the assessor.

Sec. 1992. Lists to be verified. Every assessor is liable to his property for taxation shall make out and deliver to the assessor a list of the property owned by him, a verified statement of all personal property owned by him, and a statement of all real property owned by him, in the manner of all other persons owning or possessing property in this state.

Sec. 1993. Examination under oath. Whenever the assessor shall be called upon to examine any person, he shall examine such person under oath in regard to the accuracy of the statement of the property owned by him, and to the accuracy of the statement showing the valuation of the property so listed.

Sec. 1994. Failure to obtain list. In case of failure to obtain a list of the property owned by him, a verified statement of all personal property owned by him, and a statement of all real property owned by him, the assessor shall be liable to the same extent as if he had obtained such list and statement.

Sec. 1995. Classification of Property. What constitutes real or personal property shall be determined by the assessor, and the assessor shall be liable to the same extent as if he had obtained such list and statement.

Class 1. Live stock, poultry, all agricultural products, except hogs, swine, and all household goods and furniture, including electric, mechanical, plumbing, and other personal property, shall be listed and assessed in the town or district in which the person owning or possessing the same resides, or in which the same is situated in several towns or districts, it shall be listed in the town or district in which the principal place of business of the person owning or possessing the same is situated.

Class 2. Live stock, poultry, all agricultural products, except hogs, swine, and all household goods and furniture, including electric, mechanical, plumbing, and other personal property, shall be listed and assessed in the town or district in which the person owning or possessing the same resides, or in which the same is situated in several towns or districts, it shall be listed in the town or district in which the principal place of business of the person owning or possessing the same is situated.

Class 3. Live stock, poultry, all agricultural products, except hogs, swine, and all household goods and furniture, including electric, mechanical, plumbing, and other personal property, shall be listed and assessed in the town or district in which the person owning or possessing the same resides, or in which the same is situated in several towns or districts, it shall be listed in the town or district in which the principal place of business of the person owning or possessing the same is situated.

Class 4. All personal property not included in the three preceding classes shall be listed and assessed in the town or district in which the person owning or possessing the same resides, or in which the same is situated in several towns or districts, it shall be listed in the town or district in which the principal place of business of the person owning or possessing the same is situated.

Class 5. All personal property not included in the three preceding classes shall be listed and assessed in the town or district in which the person owning or possessing the same resides, or in which the same is situated in several towns or districts, it shall be listed in the town or district in which the principal place of business of the person owning or possessing the same is situated.

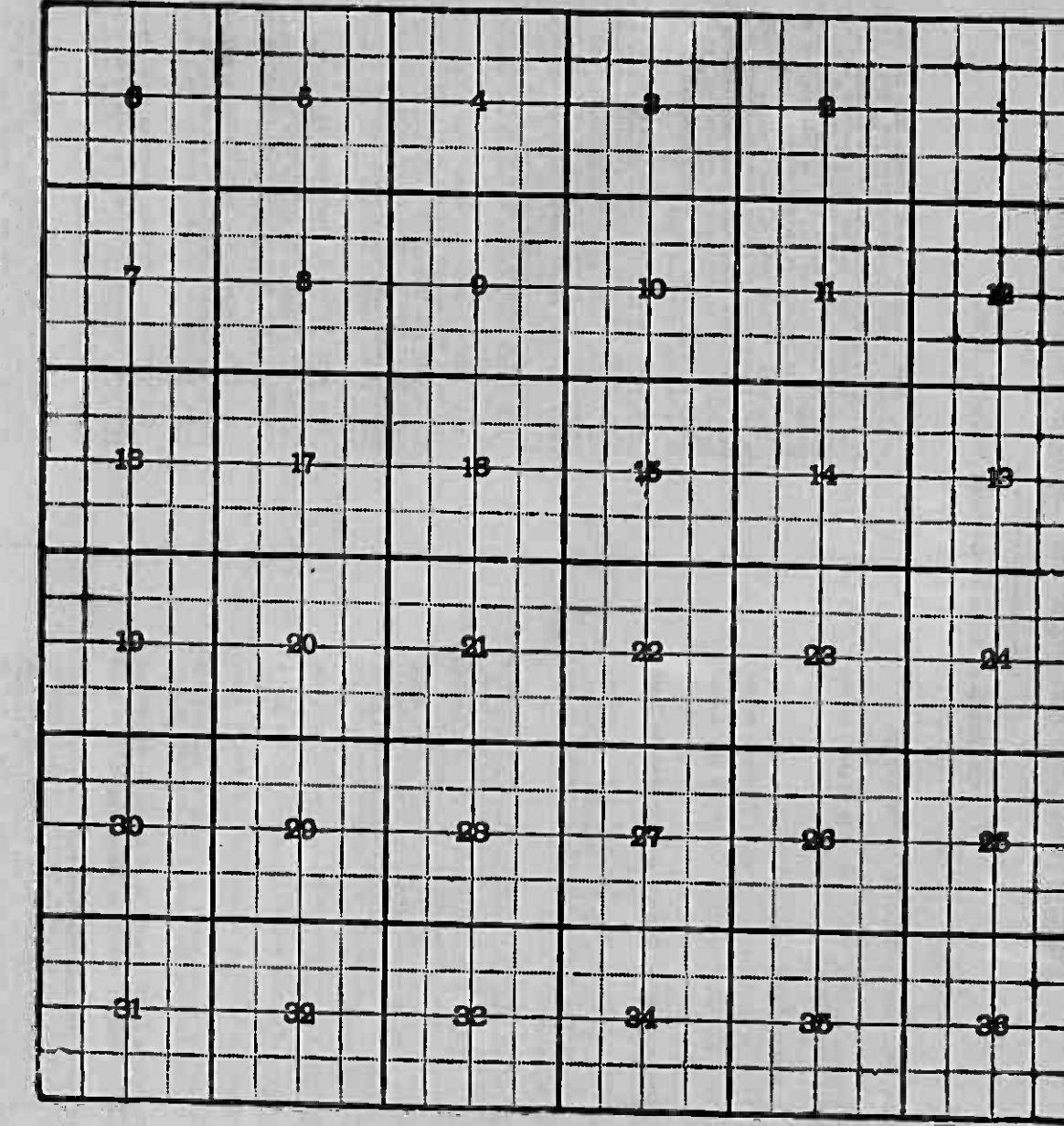
