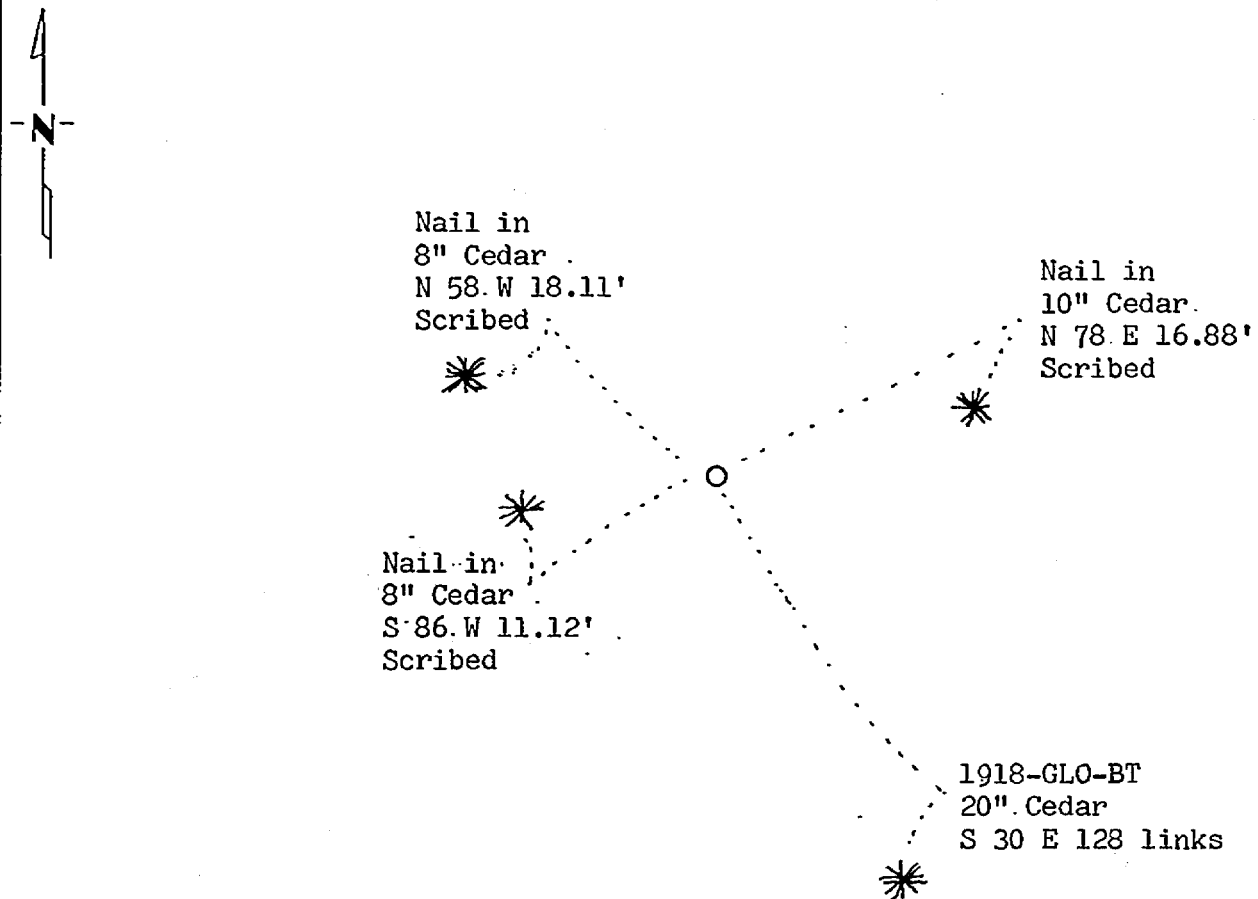

Statement of Evidence:

- 1873 U.S. General Land Office survey set wood post for this corner and marked the following bearing trees: 2" Birch N 22 W 16 links and 4" Poplar S 60 E 48 links.
- 1918 U.S. General Land Office dependent resurvey reestablished this corner by proportional distance between section corners. No evidence was found of the original post or bearing trees. An iron pipe with a marked brass cap was set to mark the corner. The following bearing trees were marked: 14" Cedar S 30 E 128 links and 4" Tamarac S 87. W 54 links. Notes show corner in cedar swamp.
- 1969  
USFS technician L. Witthoeft found the GLO brass cap monument in place and the cedar bearing tree.
- 1980 USFS technician W. Olson found the GLO brass cap monument in place up 10" in good condition and the cedar bearing tree. Three new bearing trees were marked and are shown on this certificate. A steel sign post was set 4.0' north of the corner.
- 1981 County Surveyor's Records in the Recorder's Office were checked and no resurvey information was found on this corner.
- 1981 On Dec. 22, I visited the corner and found items as per the 1980 USFS report. The Cedar BT had partially over-grown scar with scribing clearly visible. Also found a live 12" Tamarac at the approximate bearing and distance called for in 1918. However, no visible evidence was found that it was the bearing tree and I did not cut it open. I accepted the monument found as marking the same position as when set in 1918 based on the Cedar BT.
