## Statement of Evidence:

- 1871 U.S. General Land Office survey set wood post for this corner and marked the following bearing trees: 9" Ash N 22 E 28 links and 6" Ash N 59 W 15 links.
- 1907 County Surveyor's Record book B pages 323 to 327 show survey by John Curo.
  Curo states he found both Government bearing trees and set a new stake from them.
- Traversed to the area of this corner in March and at the approximate corner found a 2" Ash post painted blue with an old forestry location tag on a 14" Ash S 35 W 5.2'. We measured 5286.6' from this post to the SW corner of Sec. 34 which compared well with the 1907 Curo measurement of 5288.5'. I searched for this corner again in April after the snow was gone with USFS Surveyor K. Whitehorn, USFS technician C. Krause, and Cass County technician T. Freeman. Approximately 3 feet south of the Ash post we found a 1½" x 1½" x 24" badly rotted wood post. One side was flat with ax marks, but the rest of the post was too rotten for any other marks. This post fit well with the GLO bearings and distances to two badly rotted ash stumps. At the call distances we found the post point. I accepted this post point as the one set by Curo in 1907 and the two Ash stumps as the remains of the GLO bearing trees. At the location of the found post point set a 2" x 60" galvanized iron pipe with marked brass cap. Four new bearing trees were scribed and are shown on this certificate. Steel sign posts were set 5.0' north and 5.0' east of the corner.
