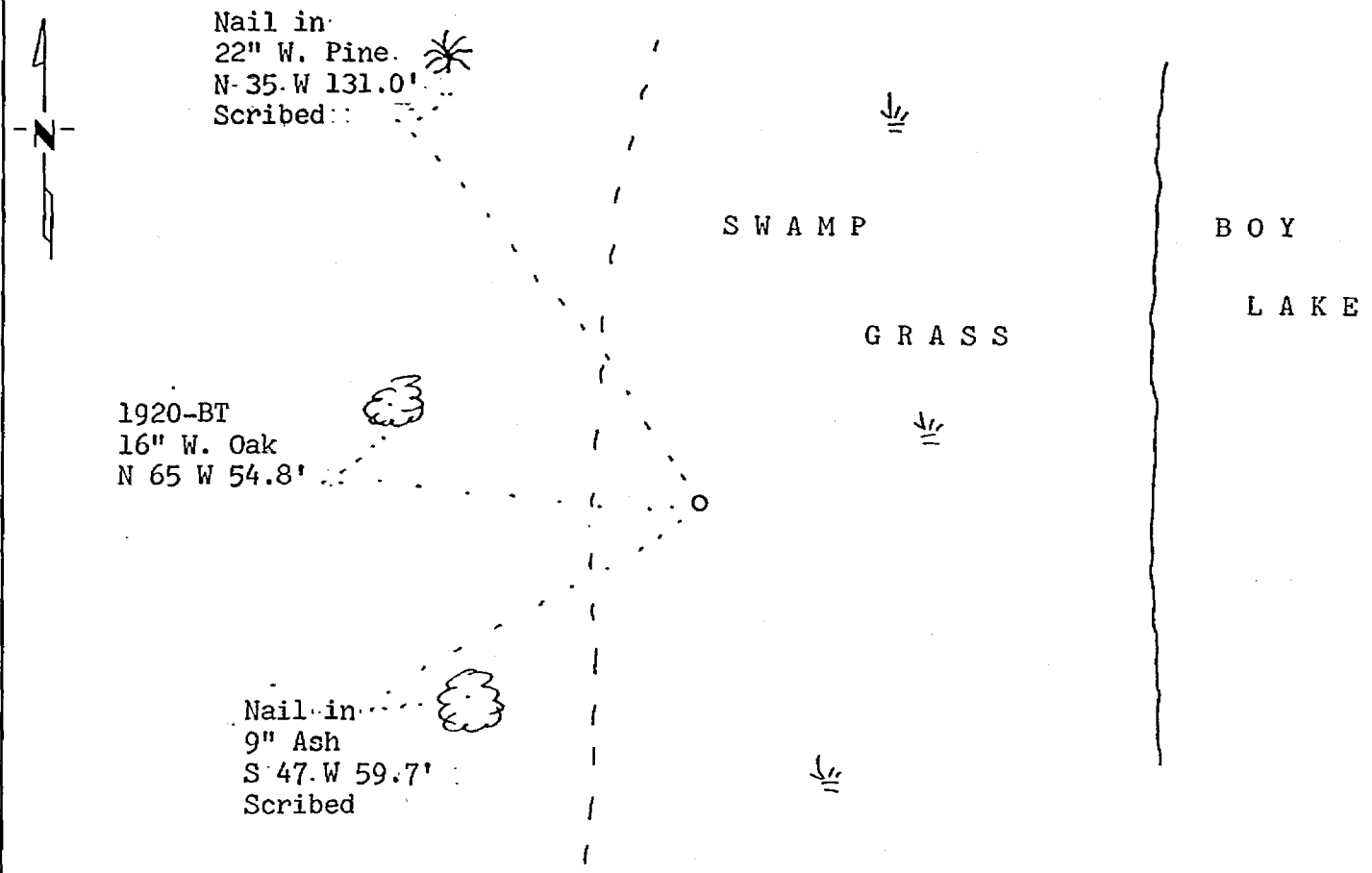

Statement of Evidence:

- 1920 U.S. General Land Office dependent resurvey established this corner and an iron pipe with a marked brass cap was set to mark the corner. The following bearing trees were marked: 24" Pine S 23 3/4 W 136 links and 6" W. Oak N 65 1/2 W 83 links.
- 1979 U.S. Forest Service technician C. Krause found the corner monumented with a GLO brass cap monument in good condition up 12" in swamp grass. Set 8' steel fence post along side and wire to monument. The following bearing trees were found: Large W. Pine stump badly rotted S 29 W 89.8' and 16" W. Oak N 65 W 54.8' with overgrown scar. Two new bearing trees were marked and are shown on this certificate. A steel sign post was set 3.8' west of the corner.
- 1982 County Surveyor's Records in the Recorder's Office were checked and no resurvey information was found on this corner.
- 1982 On Sept 10 I visited the corner and found items as per the 1979 USFS reports. Accepted monument as marking the same position as when set in 1920 by the GLO resurvey based on the bearing tree evidence.
