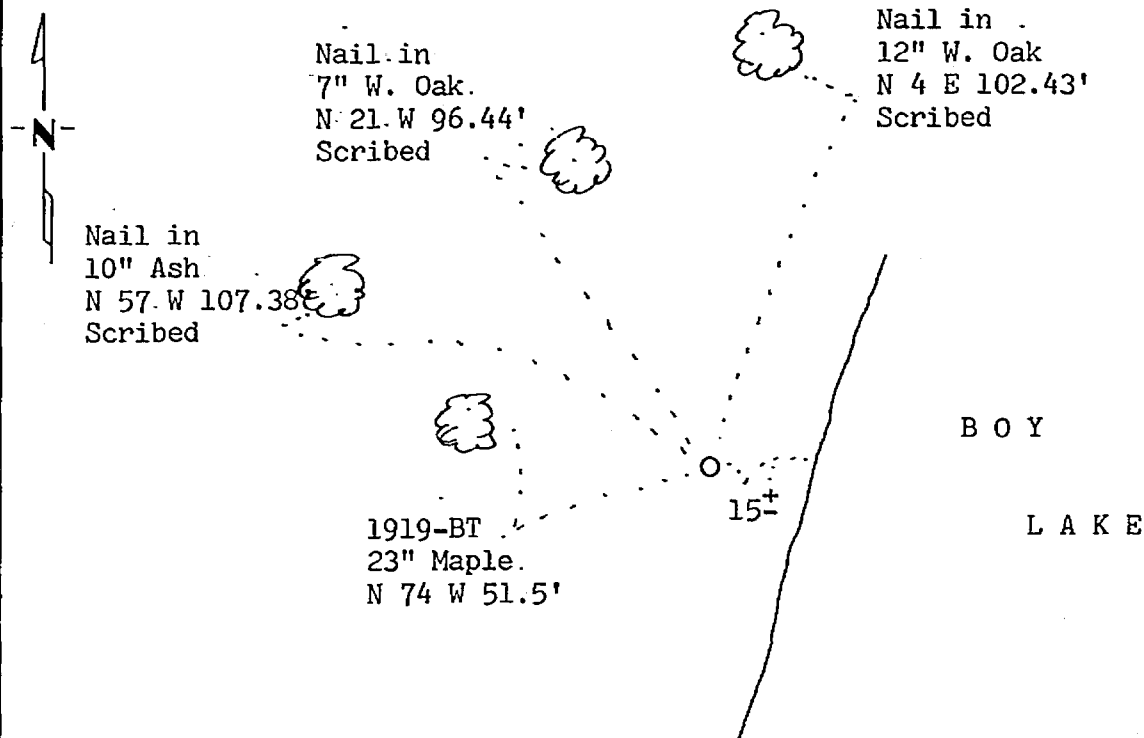

Statement of Evidence:

- 1919 U.S. General Land Office dependent resurvey established this corner and an iron pipe with a marked brass cap was set to mark the corner. The following bearing trees were marked: 10" Maple N $74\frac{1}{4}$ W 78 links and 36" W. Oak West 112 links.
- 1979 U.S. Forest Service technician C. Krause found the corner monumented with a GLO brass cap monument in good condition up 18". Lowered monument so that it is now up 8" and placed rocks around it. The following bearing trees were found: 23" Maple N 74 W 51.5' with overgrown scar. No evidence found of the Oak at the record bearing and distance. Three new bearing trees were marked and are shown on this certificate.
- 1982 County Surveyor's Records in the Recorder's Office were checked and no resurvey information was found on this corner.
- 1982 Analysis of the above data indicates that the location of this Government corner has been perpetuated. I accepted the monument as marking the corner location as when set in 1919 by the GLO resurvey based on bearing tree evidence.
