Statement of Evidence:

- U.S. General Land Office dependent resurvey established this corner and an iron pipe with a marked brass cap was set to mark the corner. The following bearing trees were marked: 16" Ash N 18½ E 90 links and 6" W. Pine S 1 E 114 links.
- U.S. Forest Service records show the following: C. Schluter found GLO brass cap monument.
- U.S. Forest Service technician G. Brama found the corner monumented with a GLO brass cap monument in good condition up 12". The following bearing trees were found: W. Pine stump S 1-E 75.2' with scribe marks. No evidence found of the Ash. Three new bearing trees were marked and are shown on this certificate. Steel sign post were set east and south of the corner.
- 1982 County Surveyor's Records in the Recorder's Office were checked and no resurvey information was found on this corner.
- On Sept. 7 I visited the corner and found items as per the 1981 USFS reports. I accepted the monument as marking the same position as when set in 1930 by the GLO resurvey based on bearing tree evidence.
