

Statement of Evidence:

- 1930 U.S. General Land Office survey set wood post for this corner and marked the following bearing trees: 8" Poplar S 16 $\frac{1}{4}$ E 48 links and 12" Birch S 73 W 36 links.
- 1934 U.S. Forest Service records show the following: CCC record shows brass cap monument found and 10" Birch S 71-30 W 36 links.
- 1968 U.S. Forest Service records show the following: L. Martinsen found brass cap monument and one bearing tree 16" Aspen S 16 E 48 links.
- 1981 U.S. Forest Service technician G. Brama found the corner monumented with a GLO brass cap monument in good condition up 6". The following bearing trees were found: 16" Poplar S 16 E 31.7'. No evidence found of the Birch. Three new bearing trees were marked and are shown on this certificate. Steel sign posts were set 4.9' north, 2.7' south, 4.8' west, and 2.8' east of the corner.
- 1982 County Surveyor's Records in the Recorder's Office were checked and no resurvey information was found on this corner.
- 1982 On Sept. 7 I visited the corner and found items as per the 1981 USFS reports. I accepted the monument as marking the same position as when set in 1930 by the GLO resurvey based on the bearing tree.
