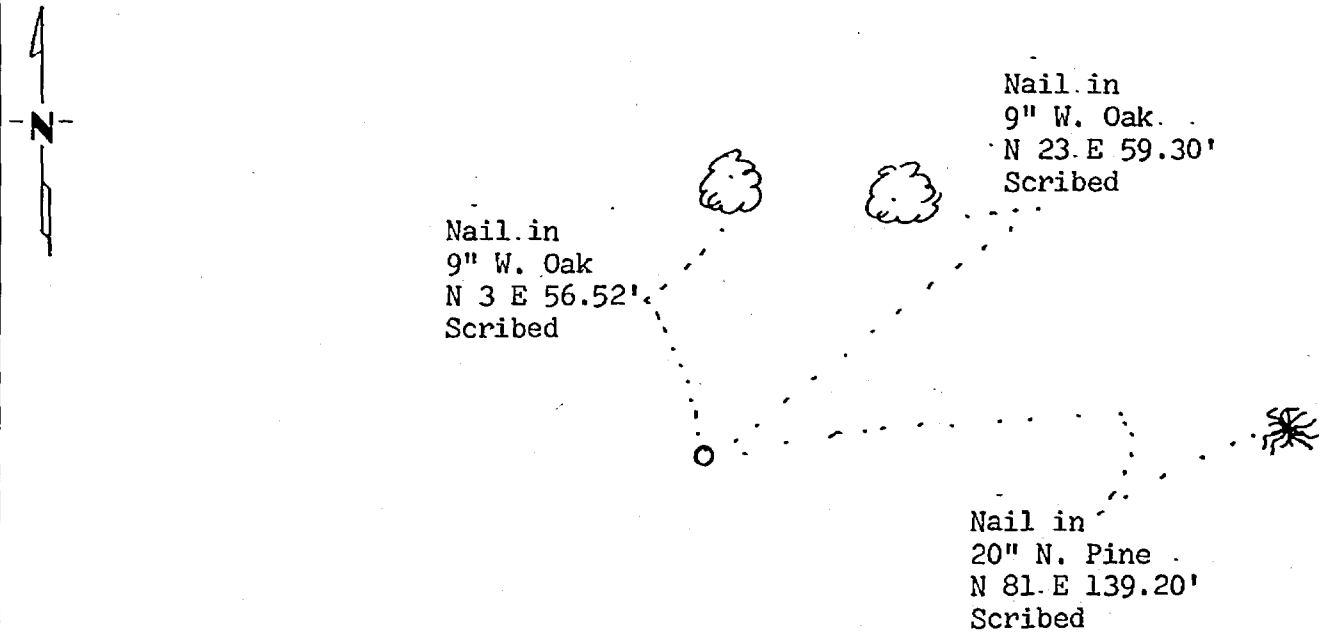

Statement of Evidence:

- 1917 U.S. General Land Office dependent resurvey established this corner and an iron pipe with a marked brass cap was set to mark the corner. The following bearing trees were marked: 6" Poplar N 35 E 47 links and 16" Poplar N 16 W 79 links.
- 1981 U.S. Forest Service technician W. Olson found the corner monumented with a GLO brass cap monument in good condition up 0.7'. The following bearing trees were found: None. Three new bearing trees were marked and are shown on this certificate. Steel sign posts were set 4.0' north and 4.9' south of the corner. Line was run south from the CW 1/16 corner of Sec. 30 through the 1/64 corner and extended to this corner. This fit good and rough distance measurements also agreed with the 1917 GLO resurvey record.
- 1982 County Surveyor's Records in the Recorder's Office were checked and no resurvey information was found on this corner.
- 1982 On Sept. 9 I visited the corner and found items as per the 1981 USFS reports. Although no bearing tree evidence was found, the line and distance check indicate that the found monument is in the same position as when set in 1917.
