1962 U.S.F.S. Corner Restoration notes indicate no evidence recovered.

He returned on December 3, and searched for evidence on the corner position but found no further evidence. He then set a monument in the lost position, with ties as shown on the sketch, midpoint and on line between the Southwest and Southeast Section corners of Section 10.
