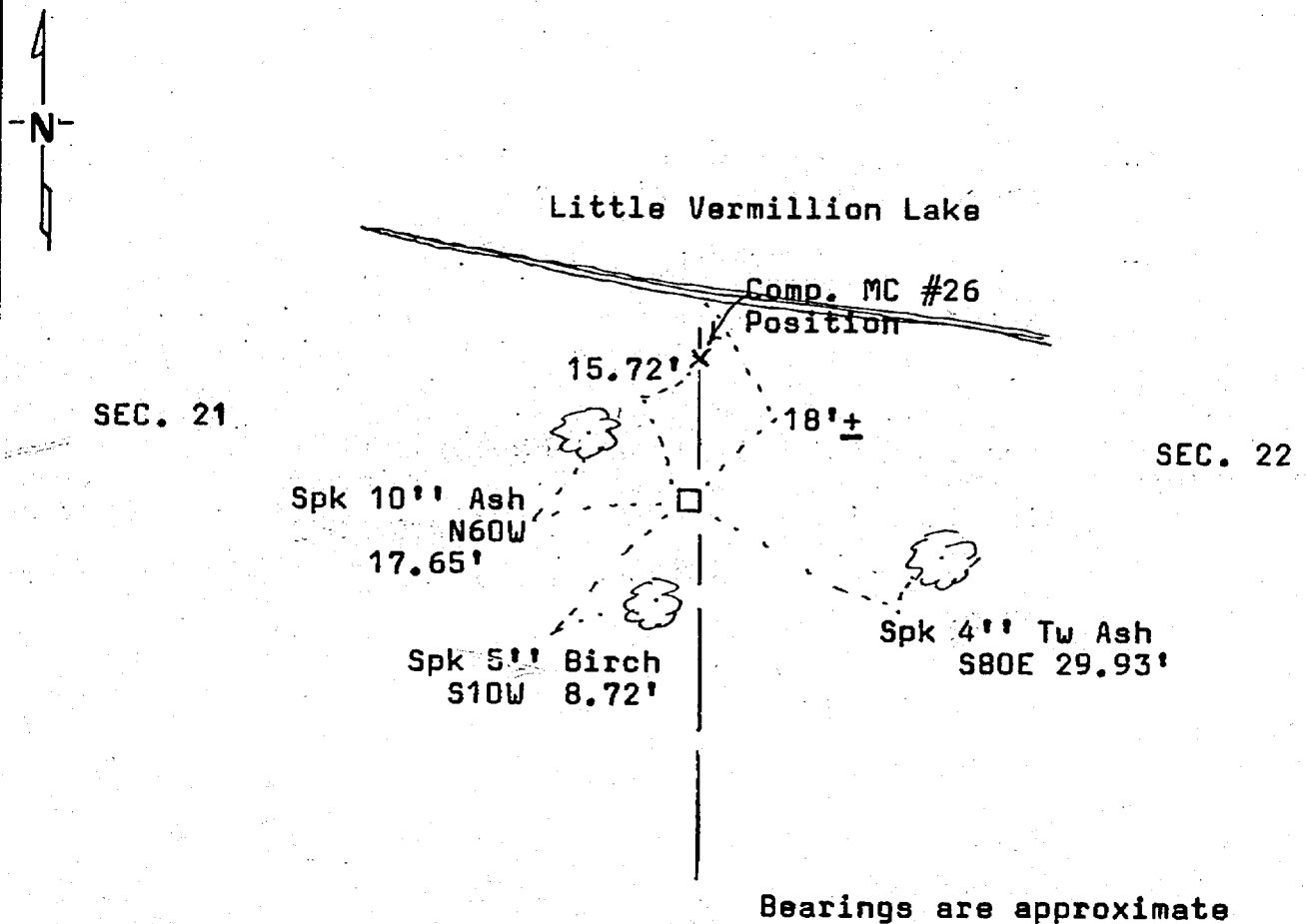

STATEMENT OF EVIDENCE

- 1872 U.S. General Land Office survey (set wood post) for this corner and marked the following bearing trees: 14" Elm S78W 4 links and 6" Elm S65-30E 12 links.
- 1900 U.S. Corps of Engineers topographical survey notes show this corner identified from one GLO bearing tree alive and one GLO bearing tree down.
- 1981 County Surveyor's Records in the Recorder's Office were checked and no resurvey information was found on this corner.
- 1981 U.S. Forest Service office in Cass Lake was contacted for information and no resurvey information was found on this corner.
- 1976- U.S. Bureau of Land Management resurvey found no evidence of this corner. Subsequent survey by them did not attempt to reestablish this corner.
- 1981- I ran a traverse around Section 21 and found no evidence of the corner or of the bearing trees.
- 1985- After BLM resurvey had established the southeast corner of Sec. 21 from the 1900 Corps survey information, I calculated this corner position based on the same 1900 survey information. This computed location fit well with the existing shoreline. No other evidence of the corner was found. Therefore, I accepted the 1900 U.S. Corps of Engineer's survey notes as the best evidence of the corner position for marking the section line. On May 23, 1985, a 2"x2" steel post with 3"x3" aluminum cap was set on the section line 15.72' south of the corner location as a reference monument.
