## CERTIFICATE OF LOCATION OF GOVERNMENT CORNER

STATEMENT OF EVIDENCE: For the South Quarter Corner of Section 19, Township 143
North, Range 26 West of the 5th Principal Meridian.

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This corner position-was originally established on August 28, 1872, by Eli W. Griffin, Deputy Surveyor, under contract to the General Land Office, now the Bureau of Land Managment (BLM).— The record of this survey is on file in the Office of the Secretary of State, St. Paul, Minnesota, and indicates that a wood post-was set to mark the corner position.—This post was witnessed by a 5 inch diameter-Spruce that bears SOUTH-36 degrees WEST a distance of 26 links (17.16 feet); and a 6 inch diameter Spruce that bears NORTH 35 degrees WEST a distance of 25 links (16.50 feet).

No intervening record of corner visitation was found so I determined the lost position using single-proportionate methods. After extensive search of the area failed to reveal any evidence of this corner position we monument the lost position as shown on the front of this document in the single proportionate position.
