

Statement of Evidence:

During April of 1871, Walker, Allen and Putnam, under contract with the U.S.G.L.O. surveyed and marked the East, North and West lines of Township 141 North, Range 26 West of the 5th Principal Meridian.

From May 1, to May 10, 1871, Walker, Allen and Putnam, surveyed and marked the interior lines of the Township.

In 1936 USDA Forest Service personnel found the original bearing trees and set a 1½" X 48" iron pipe to perpetuate the corner position.

During the 1960's, according to local landowners, surveys were made in part of Section 4 by surveyors unknown, for the purpose of laying out lots and marking boundary lines.

In November of 1986, Roger A. Mustonen, RLS #11946, under contract with the USDA Forest Service, found the 1½" iron pipe monument, and accepts same as marking the Meander Corner #.11, and replaces it with a USDA Forest Service monument. (See other side for ties, ect.) During removal of the found monument, it broke in two pieces. The larger piece, 1½" X 32" was removed, leaving the shorter piece in the bottom.

Original G.L.O. survey set a wood post, from which:

Cedar 10" N60W 13 lks
Cedar 10" S47E 7 lks.

Decaying remnants of the trees still remain.
